Organizational Setting

FAO assists Member Countries to improve diets and raise levels of nutrition, as well as supports with appropriate policies, strategies and methodologies for improving the efficiency and inclusiveness of their food and agricultural systems. As a knowledge leader, areas addressed include dietary assessment, support on nutrition-sensitive food and agriculture policies and programs, effective nutrition promotion programmes, food value chains, market linkages, post-harvest handling and agro-processing. FAO is committed to support Member States in their efforts to improve nutritional outcomes as stated in the Rome Declaration on Nutrition (November 2014) and to mainstream nutrition into FAO's strategic objectives.

The Regional Office is responsible for leading FAO's response to regional priorities for food security, agriculture and rural development through the identification, planning and implementation of FAO's priority activities in the region. It ensures a multidisciplinary approach to programmes, identifies priority areas of action for the Organization in the Region and, in collaboration with departments and divisions at Headquarters, develops, promotes and oversees FAO's strategic response to regional priorities. It also advises on the incorporation of regional priorities into the Organization's Programme of Work and Budget and implements approved programmes and projects in the region, monitors the level of programme implementation and draws attention to problems and deficiencies. It develops and maintains relations with region-wide institutions including the Regional Economic Integration Organizations (REIOs).

Reporting Lines

The Senior Nutrition and Food Systems Officer reports to the ADG/Regional Representative, with technical guidance of the Director of the Nutrition and Food Systems (ESN) Division.

Technical Focus

The Senior Nutrition and Food Systems Officer will lead the work on food systems for improved nutrition, food security, increased income and employment generation. This will include the areas of post-harvest systems management, food loss and waste reduction, food preservation, quality assurance and value addition.

Leadership and conceptual thinking for the development and implementation of comprehensive technical, statistical and/or analytical frameworks to support the programme of work and related products, projects and services in accordance with the FAO Strategic Framework

Key Functions

- Plans, manages, or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, leads, coordinates, and/or participates on Organization-wide, cross-Departmental committees, project teams, and working groups, and/or provides technical leadership/secretariat services on technical networks and/or international technical policy and standard setting bodies.
- Analyses global and country specific requirements as well as agricultural, economic, social, environmental factors to provide critical input into the FAO Strategic Framework, Programme of Work as well as Detailed Work Plans and the supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies.
- Implements and monitors work programmes involving the conception and development of comprehensive statistical and/or analytical frameworks including early warning, medium and long term plans and strategies, leading edge tools, methods, systems and databases, critical indicators, and/or policy models, etc.
- Oversees and reviews data collection, validation, analysis and reporting activities to support the development of technical standards, international instruments, innovation, FAO flagship publications/yearbooks, and/or on-going programme development as well as technical and/or policy advisory services.
- Provides technical and policy advice to Member Countries and technical support to decentralized offices in the development and implementation of their programmes of work.
- Plans, organizes and participates in capacity development activities involving the provision of advice, technical assistance projects, training workshops, seminars, and meetings as well as oversees the development of related materials, on-line tools and information kits.

- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences, advocates strategic partnerships, best practices, and increased policy dialogue and develops and negotiates effective working relationships/consensus and agreements with international and national partners.
- Leads and/or participates in resource mobilization activities in accordance with the Corporate strategy.

Specific Functions

- Provides vision, strategy, leadership and a coherent approach to enhance food systems' contribution to improved nutrition, food security, employment generation and increased income.
- Builds and maintains networks and partnerships with other organizations, the private sector and academia, including developing and in-transition countries.
- Conducts reviews, develops guidelines and analyses technical and policy issues, strategies and programmes to support the development and increased competitiveness of agro-industries.
- Provides backstopping and country-level support in the formulation of policies and programmes for food systems as part of broader strategies to promote sustainable agri-food systems and diversify income and employment opportunities, including for women and youth.
- Provides periodic assessments and analyses of food systems and nutrition situation and of relevant policies and programmes within countries of the region; and contribute to the development and maintenance of relevant information systems and databases.

- Advanced university degree in nutrition, food security, food science, agro-food engineering or a related field
- Ten years of relevant experience in integrating nutrition into agricultural policies and programmes, including international working experience in developing countries
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese, Russian
