Organizational Setting

The Regional Office for Europe and Central Asia started a project in 2017, which aims to prepare the concept and details of development programmes for the selected breeds based on a solid assessment of the existing situation of genetic resources and their production systems. State-of-the art approaches will be used for phenotypic and molecular genetic characterization of the cattle populations concerned and their production environments. These activities require the collection of relevant data from a selected group of locations, producers and animals. To achieve the goals planned during the project, the FAO REU calls for expression of interest for the position "International Consultant on Livestock Development."

Reporting Lines

Under the overall supervision of the FAO Assistant Director General for Europe and Central Asia, the direct technical guidance of the FAO Animal Production and Health Officer, Regional Office for Europe and Central Asia (FAO REU), the International consultant on livestock development will perform work in close collaboration with the National Project Coordinators, International and National Consultants and the Ministry of Agriculture (MoA), other stakeholders and partners as well as with the project staff.

Technical Focus

Support the implementation of the project on conservation of dual-purpose breeds in Europe and Central Asia with technical focus on developing and implementing a breeding programme in Ukraine, Georgia and Armenia.

Tasks and responsibilities

Research, providing guidance, technical analysis and development of breeding programs in cattle.
