### Organizational Setting

FAO's Subregional Office for the Mashreq countries is responsible for developing, promoting, overseeing and implementing agreed strategies for addressing subregional food, agriculture and rural development priorities. It develops and maintains relations with subregion-wide institutions including Regional Economic Integration Organizations (REIOs). It assists the FAO Representations (FAORs) in the subregion with addressing subregional food security, agriculture and rural development issues at country level. The Subregional Office is a subsidiary of FAO's Regional Office for the Near East and North Africa (RNE).

The post is located in the Subregional Office for the Mashreq countries in Beirut, Lebanon.

### Reporting Lines

The Senior Policy Officer reports to the Sub-regional Coordinator and maintains regular contact with FAO headquarters in Rome and FAO Regional office in Cairo for functional guidance on matters relating to policy and governance support in the food and agricultural sectors and works in close contact with the Regional Programme Leader (RPL) based in RNE.

### Technical Focus

Provides leadership, guidance and operational support for results-based policy assistance and governance work of decentralized offices in the Sub Region, in relation to regional and sub-regional policy issues, and provides guidance to the work of policy officers posted at country level in relation to their work on food security, nutrition, rural poverty reduction and sustainable development of agriculture, forestry and fisheries.

### Key Results

Development and implementation of coherent, integrated and effective policy assistance and governance work supporting member states at subregional and country level: i) in accordance with the FAO Strategic Framework and its delivery mechanisms, and ii) in response to new policy assistance requests.

### Key Functions

- Manages or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, and provides technical leadership in high-level policy analysis missions or projects, policy networks and/or international policy setting bodies
- Leads the work carried out by technical or policy officers from HQ or out-posted staff in the Decentralized Offices in relation to policy and governance work under FAO's strategic framework
- Advocates strategic partnerships, best practices, and policy dialogue in support of enhanced policies and governance for food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems
- Interacts with UN Regional and Country teams to improve cross-sectoral policies and strategies concerning agriculture, food, and nutrition security and sustainable development and works in close collaboration with the RPL, RNE;
- Analyzes regional and country-level issues to provide input into the identification of country and regional priorities and requirements
- Designs, implements and monitors regional and sub-regional policy work programmes and the supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies
- Plans, organizes and participates in capacity development activities involving the provision of technical advice and assistance, and oversees the development of related materials, on-line tools and information kits.
- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences

### Specific Functions

- Supports the improvement of the policy scope, relevance and effectiveness of Country Programming Frameworks towards achieving FAO's global goals and their implementation through FAO's Strategic Programmes, and works in close contact with the RPL, RNE;
- Develops effective working relationships and negotiates partnerships with international and national governmental and non-governmental partners, with a view to contributing to an enhanced governance of food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems;
- Promotes the implementation and monitoring at regional and country level of the Agenda 2030 Sustainable Development Goals in interaction with relevant partners;

- Leads policy reviews of the food and agricultural sectors at regional and country level, and supports monitoring and reporting on policies, action plans, initiatives and investments;
- Promotes the coherence of FAO's policy and investment support work at country level;
- Supports multi-disciplinary project development and implementation related to governance of food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems at regional and country levels.

### Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in development economics, political sciences, natural resources or agricultural economics or related field
- Ten years of experience in policy advice and analysis relating to food and nutrition security, agriculture, natural resources management or rural development, monitoring and evaluation of policies and programmes
- Working knowledge of English and limited knowledge of one of the following languages Arabic, French, Spanish, Russian or Chinese. Working knowledge in Arabic will be an asset.
