Organizational Setting

The Plant Production and Protection Division (AGP) supports countries to develop sustainable crop production systems that are resilient to external shocks and the uncertainties of climate change. AGP works with countries and a broad range of partners in developing and promoting agro-ecological approaches to sustainable crop production that build on ecosystem services while enhancing and protecting the underlying natural resource base.

The Seeds and Plant Genetic Resources Team (AGPMG) is one of the six teams in the Division. The Team leads the efforts to enhance farmers' access to quality seeds and planting materials of nutritious well-adapted crops and varieties. To achieve this, country governments are assisted in conserving plant genetic resources for food and agriculture (PGRFA), improving crops and developing resilient seed systems.

FAO International Consultant and Call purpose

The Organization frequently engages experts to work on short-term projects as international consultants. The functions of a consultant are results-oriented and normally involve analysing complex issues, directing seminars or training courses, preparing documents for conferences and meetings, or writing reports on matters within their area of expertise.

An international consultant is engaged by the Organization to provide expertise, skills or knowledge for the performance of a specific task or piece of work, which would be short-term in nature. The assignment may involve full-time or part-time functions similar to those of staff members.

The assignment can be from 1 month up to 11 months. The possibility of extension is subject to satisfactory performance and depending on the resources and needs of the Organization.

The purpose of this call is to attract talents with experience and background in the conservation and sustainable use of PGRFA, in order to populate the PGRFA roster. Qualified candidates may be contacted for interviews and if endorsed for the Roster, are available for consideration whenever relevant employment opportunities arise.

Reporting Lines

The PGRFA Specialists will work under the overall technical guidance of the AGPMG Team Leader and the direct supervision of an AGPMG Officer.

Technical Focus

AGPMG works on the conservation and sustainable use of PGRFA in the context of the Second Global Plan of Action for Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture. The work encompasses policy and technical support for *in situ* and *ex situ* conservation and on-farm management of PGRFA; crop improvement – including pre-breeding and plant breeding.

Tasks and responsibilities

The key functions of the consultant, in support of the delivery of the FAOs Strategic Programme, include:

- Support the formulation of proposals and associated supporting documentation for projects at national, regional and global levels;
- Compile and analyse technical information as input to meeting documents, training and communication materials and guidelines;
- Organize and deliver of training courses, workshops and technical meetings.

In particular:

PGRFA Specialists will assist in activities relating to the conservation of PGRFA and/or crop improvement. A typical intervention involves policy and/or technical support activities relating to:

- Enhanced conservation, including *in situ*, *ex-situ*, and on-farm management, of PGRFA; and/or
- Sustainable use of PGRFA, including for pre-breeding and in plant breeding, which may involve the applications of biotechnologies and farmer-participatory approaches;

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in Agronomy, Agricultural or Biological Sciences, with specialization in the conservation and use of plant genetic resources, molecular biology, or plant breeding.
- At least five years of relevant experience in working with public, private or civil society institutions on themes relevant to the conservation and sustainable use of PGRFA.
- Field experience, preferably in developing countries.
- Working knowledge of English and limited knowledge of Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian or Spanish.
