Summary of Duties and Functions

Under the overall guidance of the Director, Forestry Policy and Resources Division (FOA), the Deputy Director will assist with the day-to-day management of the Division. He/she will support the Director in providing strategic, managerial and technical leadership for the work of the Division and facilitate the contributions of the Division to FAO's strategic framework. In particular, the incumbent will:

- support the Director in the overall management including planning, strategic vision, advice, quality control, and ensuring the implementation of the Division's approved work plan as well as the cost-effective use of financial and human resources;
- coordinate and advise technical teams in the preparation, implementation and monitoring of work plans within the framework of FAO's strategic objectives and support team planning in defining priorities that scale-up results, focus on impact at the country level and promote cross-sectoral and multidisciplinary approaches to delivery;
- support the development of comprehensive strategies to promote the Division as an innovative centre for programme and project design and delivery in line with FAO's Strategic Objectives and Core Functions;
- ensure effective linkages between the work and staff of the Division with decentralized offices, especially in the framework of the Technical Network in Forestry;
- develop external partnerships to promote synergies and increase the effectiveness of the Division's work and mobilize extra-budgetary resources for approved programmes;
- enable a motivated and effective work force by ensuring the recruitment of highly qualified staff, mentoring, coaching and supporting career development and staff capacity development;
- represent the Division in international fora and other external and internal meetings addressing issues related to forest resources management, and serve as Officer-in-Charge in the absence of the Director.

General Requirements

- Advanced University Degree in forestry or in a related field;
- Extensive experience related to forestry and in managing for results, including experience in developing countries;
- Demonstrated leadership, managerial and supervisory skills and a strong sense of responsibility;
- Ability to develop and maintain professional contacts with government officials and international organizations;
- Well-developed communication and analytical skills;
- Demonstrated ability to lead and work effectively with a diverse team of people of different national and cultural backgrounds in an international setting;
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese or Russian.
