Organizational Setting

The Plant Production and Protection Division (AGP) promotes the sustainable intensification of crop production (SCPI). This requires the integration and harmonization of all appropriate crop production policies and practices within FAO's common vision for sustainable food and agriculture that aims at enhancing productivity; natural resources conservation; rural livelihoods and resilience.

The Senior Agricultural Officer will lead the Ecosystem Management Team (AGPME) - one of the six teams in the Division. The Team provides advice, technical support and guidance to countries aimed at sustainable increasing crop production as a key contribution to food security and promoting transformation of agricultural production to integrated agroecological production. The incumbent leads a Team of technical specialists focussing on agroecological approaches to sustainable crop production systems that also promotes interdisciplinary and cross-sectoral work towards integrated agricultural production. The Team Leader is a member of the Divisional Management Team.

Reporting Lines

The Senior Agricultural Officer reports to the Director, AGP.

Technical Focus

Support to countries in the development and implementation of sustainable integrated agroecological production systems with a focus on crop production in the context of sustainable food and agriculture and healthy diets.

Key Results

Leadership and technical policy expertise for the planning, development and implementation of Departmental / Division Programmes of work, projects, products, services in accordance with FAO's Strategic Objectives.

Key Functions

- Plans, manages, or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, leads, coordinates, and/or participates on Organization-wide, cross-Departmental committees, project teams, and working groups, and/or provides technical leadership/secretariat services on technical networks and/or international technical policy and standard setting bodies.
- Analyzes global and country specific requirements and relevant technical issues to provide critical input into the FAO Strategic Objectives, Programme of Work, work plans and the supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies.
- Implements and monitors programmes of work involving the development of the approach, evidence based strategies, and related tools, methodologies and the supporting system/database, monitoring and reporting frameworks.
- Conducts, designs and oversees research and analysis activities to support the development of technical standards, international instruments, innovation, technical reports, publications and/or on-going programme development as well as the provision of technical and/or policy advisory services.
- Provides technical and policy advisory services to Member Countries and technical support to Decentralized Offices in the development and implementation of their programmes of work.
- Leads and/or collaborates in, provides technical backstopping to and ensures the quality / effectiveness of capacity development and knowledge sharing activities within member countries such as policy support, organizational development and individual learning events including preparation of related information, learning materials, on-line tools.
- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences, advocates strategic

- partnerships, best practices and increased policy dialogue and develops and negotiates effective working relationships/consensus and agreements with international and national partners.
- Leads or participates in resource mobilization activities in accordance with the FAO Corporate strategy.

Specific Functions

- As Team Leader, manages the work of the Ecosystem Services Management Team and as member of the Divisional Management Team contributes to the technical and administrative operation of the Division.
- Promotes the identification, dissemination and adoption of integrated agro-ecological based approaches in support of sustainable agricultural production systems with a particular focus on family farmers and crop production.
- Provides technical and policy advice and guidance on sustainable crop production systems and linkages with the other agricultural sectors in the context of sustainable food systems.
- Supports on-going innovation to improve cross-sectoral integration of crop and livestock production, forestry, aquaculture and fisheries and related synergies, resource use efficiencies and productivity within sustainable crop production systems, that protect and enhance underlying ecosystem services and biodiversity and are responsive to the changing needs of family farmers.
- Leads, contributes to and/or provides technical support in the implementation of FAO's strategic framework, especially the division's work relating to sustainable, integrated and inclusive agriculture and food systems in the context of the emerging realities of climate change, erosion of biodiversity and environmental degradation.

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in Agronomy, Plant Science or related field with academic or professional specialization in crop science or related field;
- Ten years of relevant experience with public or private sector institutions, international organizations with an emphasis on the development of sustainable, inclusive cropping systems, including related policies preferably in developing countries;
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese, Russian.

- Experience in promoting integrated approaches to crop production including crop/livestock, crop/fish, and agroforestry systems is desirable.
- experience on implementing agroecological approaches for crop production in integration with other agricultural sectors (livestock, fisheries, aquaculture and forestry) is desirable;
