**GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TASK(S) AND OBJECTIVES TO BE ACHIEVED**

Under the overall guidance of the Regional Representative for Africa, the direct supervision of the FAO Representative in Malawi and the technical supervision of the Coordinator of Strategic Objective 1, the consultant will support the implementation of: *Renewed Partnership for a Unified Approach to End Hunger in Africa by 2025* in (country name). More specifically, the consultant will:

- 1) Participate on behalf of FAO in the inter-agency coordination related to food security and nutrition (FSN) i.e. mainly the ASWAP architecture, but also the social protection and humanitarian architectures;
- 2) Assist the FAO Representative in establishing collaboration and develop partnership with key strategic stakeholders and officials at all levels in FSN related sectors;
- 3) Consult and cooperate with Government and development partners to develop/adapt strategies and plans of actions that will contribute to addressing the FSN problems in the country. The main areas of focus will be those identified in the CPF i.e. ASWAP implementation including agricultural statistics, climate smart agriculture, commercialization of agriculture and resilience of poor households to shocks;
- 4) Assist the FAO Representative in providing advice to government and development partners regarding developing and implementing FSN related policies, strategies and programmes to ensure timely delivery of results. The main areas of focus will be around the FISP impact assessment, agricultural statistics, and ASWAP implementation capacity;
- 5) Support developing, implementing, monitoring and evaluating the national projects and programmes related to the implementation of the road map of the *High Level Meeting Toward African Renaissance: Renewed Partnership for a Unified Approach to End Hunger in Africa by 2025* in Malawi;
- 6) Coordinate FAO technical input and implementation of country programmes in the framework of the *Renewed Partnership for a Unified Approach to End Hunger in Africa by 2025* in close collaboration with the Regional Office, Strategic Objective Coordinators and SO Core Teams
- 7) Ensure an effective interaction and coordination between the delivery teams (at national, regional and headquarters) in the context of the *Renewed Partnership for a Unified Approach to End Hunger in Africa by 2025*
- 8) Provide analysis and recommendations to FAO Senior Management on options for policies, strategies and programmes that will contribute to achieving the *Renewed Partnership for a Unified Approach to End Hunger in Africa by 2025* objective of reducing hunger by 40% by 2017
- 9) Support the national and regional advocacy for FSN and support exchange of knowledge and lessons learned among different countries
- 10) Support resource mobilization efforts for food security and nutrition
- 11) Other related tasks required
