Under the overall guidance of the Director, NRC, and the supervision of the Programme Coordinator of the project "Making land use and agriculture part of the solution – Building capacities for Agriculture Mitigation" (MICCA), the incumbent will lead the project to develop a FAO Greenhouse Gas (GHG) assessment framework for emissions and mitigation potentials in agriculture, forestry and fisheries, including the coordination of inter-departmental arrangements in relation to project activities. In particular will:

- lead the development and implementation of the GHG framework and the development of procedures, methodologies, infrastructures and agreements to generate a global GHG assessment;
- establish a network of collaborators with expertise in agricultural mitigation, monitoring and assessment;
- coordinate the assessment of current data and information needs of key stakeholders, including member states and other end users;
- build international consensus and develop guidelines and good practices on GHG data and measurements;
- develop and organize training programmes to increase the capacity of member states to measure and use GHG data;
- establish measurement protocols, determine the analysis which will be undertaken and the structure and content of the agricultural assessment report;
- prepare policy briefs and technical papers related to GHG emissions and mitigation potential of different agricultural practices;
- liaise with external partners, including national focal points and partners such as UNFCCC and IPCC to develop common methodologies and products;
- prepare annual progress reports and annual work plans;
- perform other related duties as required.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Candidates should meet the following:

- University degree in biological sciences, environmental sciences or closely related field
- Seven years of relevant experience in the area of global environmental change, biological systems or related field
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two

SELECTION CRITERIA

Candidates will be assessed against the following:

- Extent of experience international development collaboration
- · Extent of experience in analysis of GHG emissions from the agriculture, fisheries and forestry sectors
- Extent of experience in climate change (mitigation) technical projects and international negotiations
- Level and relevance of experience and involvement in the IPCC assessment reports and knowledge of the UNFCCC process
- Depth of knowledge of agricultural statistics and experience in data analysis
- Demonstrated experience in managing for results, adapting to change, and leading and working successfully in multidisciplinary and multi-cultural teams
- Ability to develop networks and collaborations
