State of Agriculture in DPR Korea



- Harvest losses due to 2007 floods set pattern for 2008, i.e. standing crop losses, seeds for next season, food shortages, high food price rises.
- □ Damage to farm infrastructure, dams, reservoirs, irrigation systems, many watercourses remain heavily silted.



State of Agriculture in DPR Korea (cont'd)



- ☐ Farm equipment poor condition, shortages spare parts, fuel.
- Critical shortage of fertilizer.
- China exports tax introduced 1Jan 2008 heavy blow (since increased)





Response within Farming Sector



Heavy reliance on animal draught power, but animals not numerous, limited by feed, overworked.



Use of alternative fertilizer during main season but large amounts needed. Not sustainable. Very labour-demanding.

Response within Farming Sector (cont'd)



- Mass mobilization to repair farm infrastructure, but temporary, lack of materials.
- Expansion of Double Cropping, emphasis on potatoes – temporary alleviation of food shortage.
- Main crops weather favourable, no major pest outbreaks, but fertilizer shortage.

FAO/WFP Rapid Food Security Assessment Recommendations – June 2008

- Prioritize agricultural inputs fertilizer, plastic sheeting, wheat, barley seeds.
- Conservation Agriculture.
- Double Cropping.
- Vegetable production.
- Agro-forestry.
- Recovery of livestock sector.

Longer-Term Measures



- □ Varietals improvement.
- Pest eradication.
- Control of avian influenza (AI), foot-and-mouth disease (FMD).
- □ Rehabilitation/expansion of gravity-fed irrigation systems.



Review of FAO Activities in 2008



- ☐ Seeds, fertilizer, plastic sheeting provided for spring 2008 crops to farms which lost essential inputs during 2007 floods.
- Initiative Soaring Food Prices Agricultural inputs provided through UN Common Emergency and Recovery Fund and FAO Technical Cooperation Programme. Further submission to EC.
- Conclusion of Swedish-funded project on support for agriculture and horticulture (CA, fruit production, soil testing, coordination activities).

Review of FAO Activities in 2008 (cont'd)



- □ Continuity of CA through Netherlands-funded project
 − integration of potatoes into Double Cropping − main objective in 2008 is building improved potato storage.
- Al and FMD building laboratory facilities for rapid diagnostic capability.
- Forestry protection eradication of pine caterpillar threat to pine forests in watershed areas bordering western granary areas– insecticide treated bands.

- □ Foot and Mouth Disease lab diagnostics China
- ☐ Fruit production study tour China
- □ Conservation Agriculture study tour Italy
- Soil laboratory training China
- □ Training staff for BSL-2 operational standards in Avian Influenza and FMD laboratories – China





Rationale for Future Projects



- ☐ Diversity range of sectors, through involvement of ministries and technical institutes, encourage cross fertilization ideas.
- Retain focus on agriculture in higher potential cropping areas.
- Develop opportunities for coastal and highland areas.

Rationale for Future Projects (cont'd)



- Disseminate technical innovations over wider area.
- □ Economizing/rational use of high-cost inputs, i.e. fuel, fertilizer.
- ☐ Consumption, food processing/preservation.
- □ Emergency Preparedness DPR Korea prone to range of natural disasters.
