
Context for operational challenges

IPC numbers of acute food insecurity being updated, final report expected by mid June


- Initial delayed start of rains, particularly in former Central Equatoria State, but improvements since May throughout the country
- Levels of food insecurity continue to worsen in Jonglei and Upper Nile
- Insecurity restricts trade routes through the Western Corridor
- Security related incidents in Leer and Mayendit counties, including an attack on Luom in May where homes where looted, burned and destroyed

Highlights

- FAO Rapid Response Team plan to reach 83 440 households with direct distributions by the end June
- Seed Fairs have finished in Lakes, Northern Bahr el-Ghazal, Western Bahr el-Ghazal and Warrap; and are under completion in Upper Nile in time for the main planting season (June/July)
- Foot-and-mouth Disease outbreaks have been confirmed in Nimule
- In the lead up to the IPC, FAO, UN and NGO partners have conducted food, nutrition and security analysis across the county
- Crop assessment conducted by FAO, MAFS and NBS started beginning of June and active planting going well throughout the country



Initial indications (May 2017) for delayed rains and inadequate planting conditions (compared to previous years) for most of former Central Equatoria State



Famine Response in Unity State

Through dry season, main season and rapid response **80 535** households have been reached in Unity State



4 185 rapid response kits have been delivered



28 113 crop kits were distributed during the main season



43 722 vegetable kits were distributed during the dry and main season



53 680 fishing kits were distributed during the dry and main season
