Objective: To improve the food security for vulnerable communities in urban and peri-urban areas of

Antananarivo, Antsirabe and Fianarantsoa, as well as other vulnerable communities in the

south of the country.

Key partners: The Ministry of Agriculture, the Regional Directorates for Rural Development, five

agricultural service centres, and 14 international and local NGOs.

Beneficiaries reached: 9 893 vulnerable households in the urban and peri-urban areas, and 40 340 direct and

indirect beneficiary households across six districts in the south.

Activities implemented:

- Distributed agricultural production kits to 3 500 beneficiary households for the 2009/10 main agricultural season and off-season in urban and peri-urban areas.
- Distributed 25 680 kg of rice seed; 10 760 kg of dry bean seed; 6 600 kg of soybean seed; 10 760 kg of squash seed; 230 kg of sorghum seed; 4 360 kg of maize seed; and 33 280 sachets of cucumber, petsai, pumpkin, French bean and pea seeds in addition to 220 sprayers, 3 200 spades and 22 bottles of insecticide to 6 393 beneficiary households for the 2010/11 agricultural season in urban and peri-urban areas.
- Provided beneficiary households with 505 micro-irrigation kits, and trained 71 NGO technicians and lead farmers to help beneficiaries install, use and maintain the kits.
- Distributed 49 875 kg of sorghum seed; 22 600 kg of cowpea seed; 1 400 kg of lima bean seed; 20 000 kg of groundnut seed; 123 280 cassava cuttings; and 33 548 sachets of horticultural seed for the 2009/10 and 2011/12 agricultural seasons in the south.
- Produced a documentary to raise awareness on project achievements to various stakeholders.

Results:

- Increased access to seeds of improved varieties to seed producers and farmers, enabling them to restore seed stocks.
- 60 to 80 percent of the food produced in urban and peri-urban areas was used for home consumption, while 10 to 20 percent was for sale and 20 percent for seeds for upcoming agricultural seasons.
- Maize and bean production during the first phase of project implementation allowed beneficiaries in urban and peri-urban areas to meet household food needs for up to three months.
- Achieved production values ranging from MGA 400 per kg of petsai to MGA 1 000 per kg of French bean to MGA 2 000 per kg of pumpkin, thereby generating household income.
- Diversified beneficiary households' diets through improved vegetable production.
- Sorghum production in the south increased food availability during the lean season.
