Objective: To improve the food security and nutrition of vulnerable people in northeastern Nigeria

(Adamawa, Borno and Yobe states).

Key partners: The Federal Ministry of Agriculture, the Adamawa, Borno and Yobe State Ministries of

Agriculture and Natural Resources, the World Food Programme and Non-governmental

Organizations.

Beneficiaries reached: 11 600 households.

Activities implemented:

Identified and selected beneficiaries and implementing partners.

 Provided 6 000 households with 5.4 tonnes of locally produced vegetable seeds (amaranth, cabbage, carrot, lettuce, okra, onion, pepper, roselle and tomato) and 150 tonnes of fertilizer (NPK 15-15-15) in the form of two types of kits for the dry season.

• Provided 4 000 households with 50 tonnes of rice seeds and 200 tonnes of fertilizer (NPK 15-15-15) for the dry season.

• Provided 1 600 female-headed households with a total of 6 400 goats (one male and three female each).

**Results:** 

- Cultivated about 2 200 ha of land and produced an estimated 17.4 tonnes of vegetables
   enough to cover about six months of food needs and 4 000 kg of rice.
- Improved access and availability of nutritious food and animal protein.
- Improved agricultural productivity and production.
- Increased availability of productive assets among vulnerable families.
- Improved food security indicators among beneficiary households.
