Technical Assistance to Food and Nutrition Security Enhancement Project (FAO TA to FANSEP)

Introduction

Food and Nutrition Security Enhancement Project (FANSEP) is funded by Global Agriculture and Food Security Program (GAFSP). The grant agreement between Government of Nepal (GON) and International Development Association (IDA) for the FANSEP was signed on 14th November 2018. The total Project cost is 28.7 million USD of which 22.7 million USD is GAFSP grant and 6 million USD is counterpart funding from GON. The total budget allocated for FAO TA to FANSEP is 4.6 million USD. This project is implemented by Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock Development (MoALD), supervised by World Bank (WB) and Technical Assistance is provided by Food and Agriculture Organizations (FAO) of the United Nations. The project is implemented in 8 earthquake and flood affected districts of hills and terai region, aiming to reach 65,000 beneficiaries (65% female).

Project Objectives

The main objective of FANSEP is to "Enhance climate resilience, improve agricultural productivity and nutrition practices of targeted smallholder farming communities in selected areas of Nepal". The key objectives of FAO TA to FANSEP are:

- Capacity enhancement of extension personnel, Farmer Field Schools (FFS) facilitators and farmers to adopt improved climate resilient technologies and practices;
- Enhancement of capacity and knowledge base of farmers in market leverage;
- HR Institutional and capacity enhancement in providing nutrition education and raising nutritional awareness
- Planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of activities supported for assuring quality of project interventions



- Establish **TA units at national, cluster**, and municipality levels and extend technical support to PMU at all levels to enhance quality results
- Provide support for development of PMIS, monitoring and knowledge management
- Organize review and planning workshops and sharing meetings at all levels of project
- Technical backstopping support services (TSS), and monitoring

Training Conducted in Year 2022

- FAO TA to FANSEP organized 33 training events (facilitators and refresher trainings) and trained 631 facilitators (51% female) for conducting FFS (crop, livestock), NFS and FBS.
- Training Manuals- 15 FFS curricula
- 80 model field schools on crops, livestock (dairy, goat, poultry), farm business and nutrition are completed.
