

# International Encounters "FAMILY FARMING AND RESEARCH"

Montpellier, June 1-3, 2014

As part of the International Year of Family Farming (IYFF) declared by the United Nations for 2014, the research institutions of Montpellier's hub (Agropolis International) have taken the initiative to organize International Encounters on "Family Farming and Research", with the support of the French ministries of Agriculture and Foreign Affairs and various national and international organizations (CGIAR Consortium, Global Forum on Agricultural Research - GFAR, World Rural Forum - WRF).

This event will feed the agenda of IYFF and its conclusions will be presented by the Philippines at the end of 2014, it will help prepare the third Global Conference on Agricultural Research for Development (GCARD3), and contribute with ideas and recommendations to the United Nations Conference on Climate Change (COP21) to be held in Paris in 2015.

The main purpose of these Encounters is to foster exchanges and work between representatives of family farming, decision makers from the political and private sectors, trainers and researchers throughout the world. They aim at questioning and enhancing research agendas dealing with family farming issues and the challenges of global change (society, economics, food security, urbanization, human mobility and migrations, food and health, climate...).

#### A two-step event

- A public debate. A lecture by an outstanding scientist will be followed by a round table gathering
  high level experts and actors in family farming.
- A 2-day Conference. Researchers, trainers, decision makers, representatives of family farmers and
  of civil society organizations will brainstorm and discuss on research needs and priorities about
  family farming, and on research modalities for higher efficiency. The Conference will include
  thematic working sessions and plenary sessions inviting high level speakers from major institutions,
  renowned scientists and acknowledged leaders of farmers' organizations.

#### Discussion themes:

- o How global change impact on family agriculture and its various evolutions?
- How family agriculture can contribute to the global challenges facing society, economy, environment and food security?
- How scientific research and development action can support family agriculture in facing these challenges?

# Why Montpellier?

Montpellier is a cluster of the international agricultural research, endowed with numerous and dynamic research institutions in agriculture, food-processing and rural development, with high scientific quality and strong international influence. In addition, the city is hosting since 2011 the headquarters of the Consortium of the CGIAR, whose newly built offices should be inaugurated for this occasion.

# Extracts of the 144th session of the Council of FAO, June 2012

« Some of the goals of the International Year of Family Farming will be to:

- increase the public awareness about this venture in the large sense, including smallholder farming and fisheries and their contribution not only to food security but also to better nutrition, poverty alleviation, employment and livelihood,
- increase knowledge regarding the diversity and the complexity of the different production systems that exist throughout the world,
- identify and promote science and technologies, including traditional knowledge and sustainable production systems of many family farms,
- bring together public and private sector organizations and build stakeholder partnerships,
- strengthen technical support to implement concrete policies and actions at global, regional, and national community levels in ensuring sustainable development of family farming [...] »
