



56 percent of assets such as property, land, and plantations are only controlled by only 0.2 per cent of Indonesia's population (BPN, 2016).


Since 2003 to 2013, every minute there is one family farmer to abandon agriculture. about 0.25 hectares per minute, the land converted from agriculture to non-agriculture. The peasants house houlds have reduced to 5.04 millions. (BPS, 2014)
