Calling for action in the areas of science, policy, economics and practices for forests and water, the Plan was drafted over the last two years by an expert group and partner organizations from around the world.

Our objectives

The event will propose tangible solutions.

- Increase international research on forest water interactions in different contexts.
- Promote cross-sectorial institutional mechanisms and adoption of forest-water policies.
- Support the integration of forest–water relations in forest management practices.
- Advance the Forests and Water Agenda, and consolidate a network of committed partners.
- Launch the Five-year Forests and Water Action Plan.



Why forests and water?

Forests use water, but they also provide water.

Forests and trees regulate surface and groundwater flows; maintain high water quality; help reduce water-related risks, such as landslides, floods and droughts; and contribute to the prevention of desertification and salinization.

- One in six people do not have access to safe drinking water.
- 80% of the global population lives in areas where water resources are insecure.
- More than 1/3 of the world's major cities rely on drinking water from forested areas.
- While demand for fresh water is rising, supply is growing scarcer.
