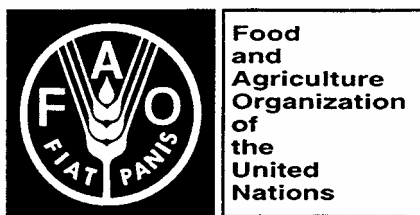

FORWORD

The FAO/IPC Directory available on the website of the International Poplar Commission (<http://www.fao.org/forestry/site/19228/en>) includes **Name, Affiliation, Address, Telephone/Fax numbers and e-mail** of all those scientists and experts that filled in the address circulated by the IPC in 2000. In addition, one or more **codes** are reported: they refer to the **fields of activity** of each expert and are **indicated by the experts themselves**. The codes are listed below by subject.

The web based directory contains details for about 500 experts, however, for full usefulness, it requires regular maintenance to expand and update data. These forms will be distributed through list servers, on the IPC and National Poplar Commission websites and circulated through the National Poplar Commissions of Member Countries for distribution to appropriate institutions working with Poplars and Willows.

In order to improve the efficiency and efficacy of the Directory, all Scientists are invited to:

- a) Check the database and e-mail a new completed form if you wish to be added;
- b) Correct mistakes (if any) if they are already included in the Directory by sending an e-mail with a new form, with corrections flagged);
- c) Attach a summary curriculum vitae highlighting your Poplar and/or Willow expertise and experience; and
- d) Distribute blank forms and notes and explanations to the largest possible number of colleagues who are not yet included in the Directory, inviting them to respond by e-mail to the coordinators of the Directory.

Notes and explanations about the address forms

1. If the whole name (e.g. of the Institute) is too long, please make the **appropriate abbreviations** yourself. Split the Organization's name, as well as the address, if necessary, considering that it will appear in an address exactly as you write it.

E.g. *NOT* *University of New Brunswick, Department of Forest resources* **BUT** **University of New Brunswick
Department of Forest Resources**

2. **Postal code** (or ZIP code) - **follow the rules of your Mail Service.**

In continental Europe it is made of a country code followed by 4 or 5 numbers: e.g. I-15033 for Casale Monferrato, Italy; NL-6700 for Wageningen, the Netherlands. In the United Kingdom and Canada it is made of two separate groups of letters and numbers, with a space in between. In India and China, it is made of a row of 6 numbers.

3. **Town name** should be followed, where appropriate, by Province / County / State name or abbreviation. Give preference to abbreviations if official ones are available.

E.g. AMES IA, TORONTO ONT., CAMPANA BS.AS., NANJING JIANGSU, CASALE MONFERRATO AL.

In any case, **follow the rules of your Mail Service.**

4. **Telephone and telefax:**

Country prefix is the number that identifies the Nation: 1 for USA and Canada, 33 for France, 86 for China, 353 for Ireland etc. Do **not** write the leading numbers that you must dial in your country when you make a telephone call abroad, as these vary from country to country (e.g.: 00, 07, 09, 010, 011, 19, etc.).

District Prefix is made of the figures that you must dial before a number when you make a long distance call **within your country**. Please omit any leading number that is usually dropped when calling from abroad. Examples of correct district prefixes: 416 for Toronto, 238 for Orléans, 10 for Beijing, 0142 for Casale Monferrato.

The **telephone/fax number** will be written as it is dialled for a local call. Please add extension only if it can be dialled directly from the outside. Do not add an extension if it is the local operator that has to dial it.

5. **Fields of activity.** Cross a **maximum of 4 boxes**. If more than 4 apply to your case, please select the 4 that you consider the most suitable (either for time devoted or for the degree of specialization).
