The Food and Trade Network for East Africa (FATNEA) is a membership-based regional, non-governmental, not-for-profit organisation formed in October 2002 to facilitate and articulate regional strategies to contribute positively to agricultural development, food security, poverty reduction as well as achieving fairer and more equitable trading conditions for agricultural producers in the East African region – while placing particular emphasis on fisher folks, pastoralists and the small-scale farming sub-sector which is dominated by women.

FATNEA's **mission** is to promote food security and fairer and more equitable trade, with the ultimate aim of reducing poverty, through lobbying, advocacy and capacity building for East African regional stakeholders.

The **overall goal** of FATNEA is to see communities in East Africa empowered and sufficiently organised to make their informed choices about improving the quality of their lives through increased food security and fairer and more equitable trading conditions.

FATNEA's **main objectives** are:

- ✚ To carry out research and advocacy, as well as to support national capacity building initiatives related to trade and food security.
- ✚ To bring together stakeholders at the intersection of food security and trade to discuss issues of common concern as well as issues of specific concern to countries in the East African Region.
- ✚ To inform the public, particularly grassroots-level farmers and farming groups, on trade and food security issues and increase their knowledge, particularly on the implications of the multilateral trading system and African regional economic integration.

- ✚ To influence trade policymaking at the national, bilateral, regional and international level with the aim to promote policies that enhance food security and a fair and equitable trading system, while at the same time providing for a pro-poor, pro-development perspective.

### **Membership of FATNEA**

Membership of the Network is open to both individuals and institutions/corporate entities from the public and private sector as well as civil society in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania, which subscribe to the ideals and aims of FATNEA. Membership falls under the following categories.
