# 1. Opening

The Second Meeting of the Ad Hoc Committee on the Standard Material Transfer Agreement and the Multilateral System of the Treaty ('the Committee') will be held in Brasilia, Brazil, from Tuesday 31 August – Thursday 2 September 2010.

The meeting will be held in English only.

#### 6. Visa/customs

Participants from countries that require an entry visa for Brazil are strongly advised to contact the nearest Brazilian diplomatic or consular mission **as soon as possible** in order to secure the required entry visa in a timely manner, prior to departure. It should be noted that, under Brazilian law, it is not possible to acquire a visa upon arrival in Brazil. Furthermore, air line companies **do not allow boarding** in the absence of a valid visa.

To facilitate the issuance of visas, the Secretariat will issue upon request letters to be attached to the visa applications.

The official language in Brazil is Portuguese, however English is widely spoken in Brasilia.

In July, average temperatures in Brasilia range between  $20 - 26^{\circ}$ C in the daytime and a  $12 - 18^{\circ}$ C at night. The standard time zone will be GMT – 3 hours. ## 11. Dress Code

220 volts, 60 Hertz. Inlet sockets are either for two-pin, flat and vertical plugs, or two round pins.

# 13. Currency

The currency in Brazil is the Brazilian Reais (R\$). The current exchange rate is roughly US 1 = R 1.77 and Euro 1 = R 2.30.
