EUROPEAN PRICE REPORT

LATEST TRENDS

Overall, fish supply this year has been limited. This is especially true for groundfish, tuna, shrimp and squid. As demand for seafood in Europe continues to increase, prices of all major fish species trended upwards this year, and this trend is likely to continue during the closing months of the year and well into 2017.

CONXEMAR, recently held in Vigo, was a very successful event for the European fisheries industry, and the demand for stand space was greater than the available supply. Cephalopods and labour conditions for the fishing and fish processing industries were some of the key themes of side events at this important fair.

GROUNDFISH

The 2017 cod quota in the Barents Sea will be 10 percent lower than the 2016 quota. The Barents Sea cod recommendation, combined with slightly declining landings of Alaska pollock, will mean tighter groundfish supplies in 2017. Limited cod availability is already being seen this year, which, coupled with strong demand, has resulted in increasing prices.



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The **European Fish Price Report**, based on information supplied by industry correspondents, aims to provide guidance on broad price trends. Demand for wet-salted cod fillets from frozen raw material (*Gadus macrocephalus*) is starting to increase with the start of the main consumption period. Producer's stocks are low, however. Demand is also starting to strengthen for wet-salted cod fillets (*Gadus morhua*) from fresh raw material of Faroese and Icelandic origin. Availability of final product is limited as the new fishing season started in September.

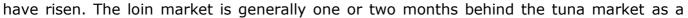
Demand for Alaska pollock is good on the Russian market, although availability of large Alaska Pollock is low. The price has risen and is expected to stay at the current level.

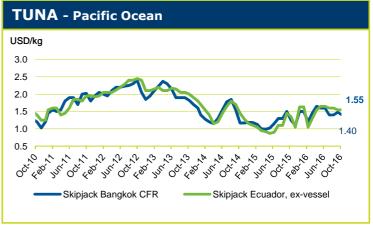
TUNA - BILLFISHES

The canned tuna sector in Europe has shown little buying interest during the whole of this year, a trend which continued into October. Winter is not a very strong sales period for canned tuna in any case, so any improvements in the market are likely to be seen in March next year at the earliest. Overall, raw material prices are declining for both whole yellowfin and skipjack, although reports suggest prices for yellowfin loins have risen. The loin market is generally

whole in terms of price trends. Catches by Ecuadorian vessels after the lifting of the 2-month closure are reported to be slow, and prices were expected to go up, but vessels from the Western Pacific are also landing in Ecuador as demand is very slow in Thailand and other Asian countries. As a result, inventories at Ecuadorian canneries are currently high and the skipjack price has remained stable, despite the limited catches. However,







some increase in prices is now foreseen in early 2017.

Catches in the Western and Central Pacific (WCP) remain at a slow-to-moderate level. The Japanese, Kiribati and Republic of Korea fleets have been able to set on FADs since 1 October, while the other fleets are now in their final month of FAD closure.



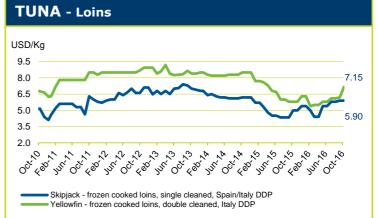
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Thai Canneries are reporting healthy raw material inventories as fish arrivals from the Indian

Ocean continues. The skipjack price at major canneries has decreased.

Catches in the Indian Ocean are being maintained at a moderate-to-good level and local canneries continue to report healthy raw material inventories. Transshipment activity continues with fish being diverted to the Bangkok market.



While fishing in the Atlantic Ocean has

slowed down due to poor weather, raw material inventories at local canneries remain healthy. Skipjack and yellowfin prices for the canneries in Western Africa have declined somewhat.

European market prices for skipjack and yellowfin are also still declining for whole frozen, while they increased sharply for yellowfin loins.

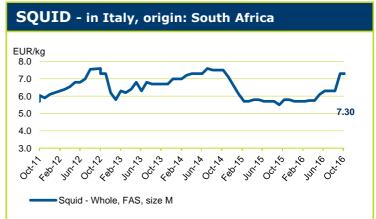
SMALL PELAGICS

Reports from the Moscow market point to stable prices for herring from the autumn catch, for which consumer interest and demand is increasing.

CEPHALOPODS

There is a severe lack of squid in the European market at the moment and low production from Latin America has overshadowed all activities this year. Inventories are practically empty, and prices are skyrocketing.

Landings of squid are good in South Africa, with a high proportion of small sizes. But continuing strong demand indicates just how starved the market is, especially with few alternative sources of



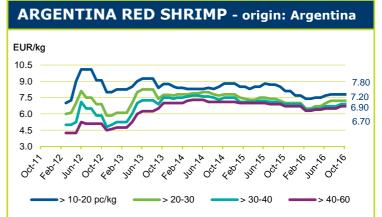


supply. Fishing will be halted on 19 October, reopening on 23 November, and the feeling is that there is appetite from the market even at the present price level.

Octopus prices are reportedly stable, but Morocco and Mauritania are just about to enforce a 2-month fishing ban, which should lead to price rises.

CRUSTACEANS

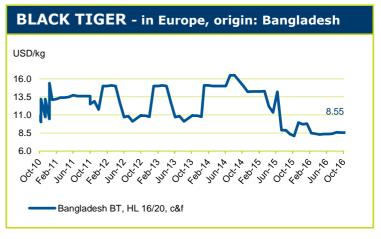
Demand for shrimp increased quite strongly during 2016 compared with last year. As a result, prices moved upwards for all species and all sizes. Indonesia, an important supplier to the European market, reported short supply as result of bad weather, white spot and white feces in September. Farmers have reduced stocking to prevent heavy losses. This situation is pushing up raw material prices day by day.



Shrimp fisheries in Argentina are declining and national authorities are envisaging closing the grounds under national jurisdiction, possibly several weeks before the 2015 closure date. Meanwhile, the catches of the trawler fleet targeting fresh shrimp production are not good either and this year's campaign is expected to be worse than previous years. This is applying

significant upward pressure to prices at origin.

In Europe, although there are still stocks of sizes 10/20 and 20/30, the bad news arriving from Argentina has created some concern amongst buyers and they have started buying at high prices in order to secure the required volume as soon as possible for the next Christmas campaign. This fear of a supply shortfall is driving prices higher for all sizes.



Demand for crab typically rises in the latter part of the year as quality is optimum and processors start building stocks for market. Frequent price variation depending on weather.



Lobster prices are increasing as normal during the last quarter, as it is the end of the core fishing season and the main consumption period.

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BIVALVES

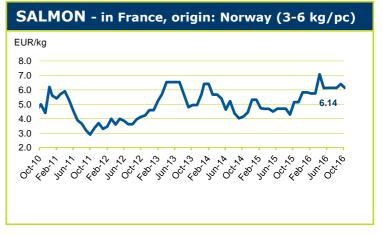
Oyster mortalities were again present this summer and may leave a tighter supply demand situation in the last quarter as stocks will not be as high particularly for large sizes. Prices which had been down ay about EUR 0.50/kg for the dozen this year, are likely to go up towards the festivity season.

The French Bouchot mussel season is in full production. Some Bouchot growing regions have been severely affected by mortalities with strong regional variations in rates of mortality. Dutch mussels are therefore well present in the French market and used as a promotional reference. Larger tray sizes are being used for promotional items.

SALMON

After the typical temporary drop in Norwegian farmed Atlantic salmon prices at the end of the third quarter that accompanies high late-summer harvest volumes, the trend has turned upwards once again in October as supply tightens once more and end-of-year demand kicks in. According to the NASDAQ salmon index, average prices for fresh farmed Atlantics out of Norway reached NOK 58.8/kg (US\$ 7.15/kg) in week 40, about 50 percent higher than the same week in 2015. The higher price level this year has translated into further export revenue gains for Norway, with the Norwegian Seafood Council (NSC) reporting total salmon

exports of NOK 44 billion in the first three quarters of 2016, 30 percent higher than the same period last year. Exports to almost all of Norway's traditional EU markets, with the top two spots occupied by France and Poland, increased by at least 20 percent in value terms, with the exception of the United Kingdom where importers' purchasing power has been hurt by the significant weakening the British pound following the referendum vote to exit the European Union. On the



production side in the UK, harvest volumes in the Scottish farmed salmon sector are expected to return to growth this year. In a recent report published by the Scottish government, production this year is forecast to reach 177 900 tonnes, approximately a 3.5 percent increase compared with 171 700 tonnes in 2015.





Biomasses at Norwegian farms have remained below last year's levels for most of this year, and the expected result is a contraction of Norwegian supply. Combined with major production difficulties in the world's other major farmed salmon producing country, Chile, and strong demand growth in both traditional and alternative markets, the result is that prices will continue to be supported at high levels for the foreseeable future. This is of course good news for producers, but they are mindful of the fact that costs are also expected to increase, with analysts from Nordea predicting that the cost of producing one kg of farmed salmon in Norway will reach NOK 40/kg (US\$ 4.87) by 2020. The result for the consumer is an inevitable and irreversible hike in retail prices, at least until there is major innovation at the farm level allowing us to produce more salmon more cheaply.

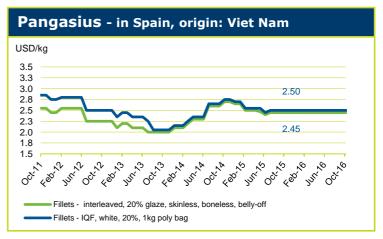
TROUT

In the first three quarters of 2016, Norwegian exports of farmed trout doubled compared with the same period in 2015, to a total of NOK 3 billion as reported by the NSC. This impressive jump in export revenues reflects the success of Norwegian efforts to develop a range of alternative markets, particularly in Asia and Eastern Europe, to compensate for their being shut off from the Russian market in August 2014. These efforts have in fact increased the industry's sales to levels significantly above those observed before the Russian trade ban. As a consequence of this booming demand, biomasses have fallen at Norwegian trout farms and supply is tightening, meaning that trout prices can now be expected to trending upwards.

FRESHWATER FISH

Tilapia supply has been low this year due to extreme weather conditions in China which have impacted production. As a result, prices have been rising for most of the year and it is only this month that some downward price adjustments have been reported.

Pangasius prices are stable, meanwhile, and supply is steady this year after some significant cuts in 2015.

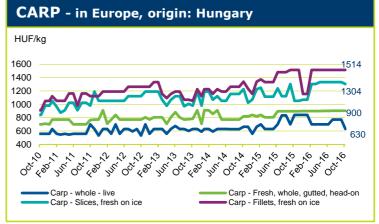




ile perch catches continue to be very disappointing, and prices have been increasing during all of 2016. Overall a price hike of almost 40 percent has been reported over the last year.

This situation is unlikely to improve as important resource has this been overfished for several years now and the size of landed fish has declined. Indeed, the minimum legal size had to be lowered as otherwise the whole processing industry around Lake Victoria would lay idle. The demand in Europe for this fish continues to be strong, as its sweet taste and its pink colour are well accepted by consumers.

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Carp supply in Hungary is good, and prices are going down slightly. Good weather conditions are allowing for easy transport of live fish to the market.

SEABASS - SEABREAM - MEAGRE

Prices of seabream are now lower than those of seabass, in contrast to the norm in recent

years. This month, seabream prices have dropped significantly compared with September, by almost 5 percent, particularly for smaller sizes. Prices for seabass have also declined, but the drop is in the 1-2 percent range.

Year on year, prices on European markets for farmed bass and bream have been somewhat lower in 2016 compared with the relatively high levels seen last



year, and October prices for Greek 300 – 450 gr/pc fish on the Italian market this month were $\leq 4.80/\text{kg}$ for bass and $\leq 4.95/\text{kg}$ for bream. These figures represent declines of 6 percent and 10 percent respectively compared with the same month in 2015.





Similar trends at the wholesale level can be observed in all the major European markets with the exception of France, where distinct consumer preferences mean price trends are often different. In general, market demand for both bass and bream, although still very seasonal, is good at present as slowly recovering economies in key EU markets boost consumers' willingness to spend. This is supplemented by the ongoing development, primarily by Turkish exporters, of new markets across the Middle East and in the US. Hence, the price decline is being driven by supply-side dynamics rather than demand-side, specifically increasing volumes coming out of Turkey, supported by exchange rate trends, and also out of Spain. Given the current price situation and the barely sustainable margins in the Greek sector in particular, the magnitude of further supply growth over the next few years is potentially a matter of concern for the industry considering particularly high juvenile production this year, 18 percent higher than in 2015. In the shorter term, prices can be expected to continue to slide downwards until the end of the year, before starting to climb again in the early 2015.
