Financial Report on Progress of the Work Programme and Budget for the 2016-2017 Biennium – Update at 16 October 2017

Executive Summary

Document IT/GB/17/27 deals with the financial position of the International Treaty in its entirety and was prepared using the financial data available at 30 June 2017. It was noted at the time that any significant financial matters occurring during the period July – October 2017 would be reported to the Governing Body at the time of its Seventh Session.

This Addendum document gives updated data on financial changes that have occurred during the period 1 July – 16 October 2017, in particular with regard to receipts.

Particular emphasis is placed on the Core Administrative Budget as provided for in Financial Rule III.3a but summary information is also provided on other donor-supported Treaty Trust Funds.



I. INTRODUCTION

- 1. This document provides an update at 16 October 2017 to the financial position of the International Treaty prepared using the financial data available at 30 June 2017.
- 2. It is noteworthy that the level of voluntary contributions received during the first twenty-one months of the biennium has exceeded receipts during the same period in the 2014-15 biennium.
- 3. This document also provides summary information on the donor-supported Funds (the Special Funds for agreed purposes, and the Fund to Support the Participation of Developing Countries) which are considered to form part of the Budget of the Treaty (in accordance with Financial Rule III.3b), as well as on the Benefit-sharing Fund (for the disbursement of funds resulting from Article 13.2d of the Treaty).
- 4. The section and Appendix numbers in this document indicate the original references in the main document which has been updated to 16 October 2017 from the previous reporting date of 30 June 2017.

II. THE CORE ADMINISTRATIVE BUDGET

Contribution from Contracting Parties

5. As at 16 October 2017, 55 Contracting Parties (out of 135 plus the European Union) had contributed to the Core Administrative Budget, for a total of USD 4,151,964.58 (including amounts due to the Working Capital Reserve and Third Party Beneficiary Operational Reserve).

- 6. Contributions to the Core Administrative Budget for 2016-17 were equivalent to approximately 79.07% of the contributions expected from Contracting Parties, or approximately 56.81% of the total CAB (including FAO and Contracting Parties' contributions).
- 7. The contributions received from the European Union totalled USD 112,873.86 (Euro 100,000) of which 50,000 received in October 2016 (but not credited to the Treaty's account until July 2017 due to a bank error) and a further 50,000 on 5 July 2017. Considering these contributions, the total amount received from Contracting Parties amounts to 81.28% of expected contributions, a result in line with previous biennia.





III. DONOR-SUPPORTED SPECIAL FUNDS

- 12. A revised Appendix 6 is included, giving the updated status of receipts to donor supported funds and includes details of contributions to other Treaty projects not previously reported.
- 13. In view of the financial burden resulting from convening the Seventh Session of the Governing Body, the Fund to Support the Participation of Developing Countries has now been entirely exhausted. Contracting Parties are urgently invited to make contributions to the Fund in order to facilitate the support and vital participation of developing countries in Governing Body processes in the forthcoming biennium. The total estimated need for the 2018-19 biennium is in the amount of USD 450,000, including a minimum reserve.




Geographical distribution by amounts
