Monitoring and Analysing Food and Agricultural Policies

➤ Background

An enabling policy environment is key for agricultural development, food security and poverty reduction in developing countries. With improved capacity, government policy analysts and decision makers can generate and use reliable evidence on the impact of their policies on value chain actors, from farmers to consumers. Government policies can become more consistent with the overarching goals of food security and agricultural development.

Since 2009 MAFAP successfully partnered with government institutions and research organizations in several developing countries. The aim was to create policy monitoring systems and carry out consistent set of policy and public expenditure analyses across a wide range of agricultural value chains.

From 2015 MAFAP has built on these partnerships and evidence to support the reform of those policies that constrain agricultural development and affect, in particular, smallholders.

Objectives


MAFAP supports Governments to identify, articulate and assess options for reforming food and agricultural policies. The programme has four objectives:

- Collect, assemble and use targeted and policy-relevant data, including prices, market access costs and public expenditure in support of the food and agricultural sector, as well as policy decisions.
- Consolidate and strengthen national policy monitoring systems to measure policy effects and identify current policy 'problems' that affect the competitiveness of agricultural producers.
- Articulate policy options and assess respective ex-post and ex-ante analysis to support suitable government reforms.
- Engage national stakeholders and development partners in policy dialogue, as part of a more inclusive policy reform process.


