

RECOVERED PAPER DATA, 1997-1998

INTRODUCTION

Statistical data on recovered paper is produced by two organizations: the Confederation of European Paper Industry (CEPI) and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), with CEPI covering European countries and FAO the world. There was thus a duplication of work for Europe which was surveyed by both organizations, resulting in unnecessary work by the respondents. Furthermore, there were some differences in definition and classification causing confusion in readers of the surveys.

As a first step to eliminate duplication and standardize definitions, it was commonly accepted by the two organizations that each one would publish its own survey, with CEPI handling the data collection for Europe and FAO for all the countries but using CEPI data for European countries. Steps are being initiated to have as soon as possible a single unique survey of recovered paper issued jointly by CEPI and FAO.

Data was not available from the Russian Federation for the period, but there is a possibility that some statistical data may be available next year.

The document will follow the same presentation as in the previous surveys, and presents historical data for a two-year period, in this case years 1997 and 1998. The survey also includes projections of recovery and use of recovered paper for the years 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2002 for some countries.

The survey presents data on recovery, trade, and utilization of recovered paper.

The format of the questionnaires used in this survey is the same as the one used in the past, with the addition of a question relating to the use of recovered paper for energy generation to which, unfortunately, very few respondents could answer. The ratios used to analyse the data are the ones recommended by the Sub-group on Waste Paper Terminology, and are defined later in this document. Appendix 1 contains a sample of the questionnaires, which were sent to 130 countries.

The 37¹ countries which answered the questionnaires represent 82 percent of the world paper and paperboard production, and the data presented can be considered representative of the recovery, use and trade of recovered paper in the world.

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED

_

The FAO Advisory Committee on Pulp and Paper created a Sub-group on Waste Paper Terminology to define the terms to be used by FAO to describe waste paper recovery and utilization. The two changes made concern the terminology and apply to waste paper utilization rate and waste paper in fibre use rate, which have been renamed recovered paper utilization rate and recovered paper in fibre use rate, respectively. The following rates are used in this survey:

- a) Waste paper net recovery
- b) Adjusted waste paper net recovery
- c) Recovered paper utilization rate
- d) Recovered paper in fibre use rate

The definitions of the rates are given below:

a) waste paper net recovery rate:

is the amount of waste paper collected for re-use as a percentage of the adjusted paper and paperboard consumption;

(Note: the adjusted paper and paperboard consumption is equal to the apparent consumption of paper and paperboard plus the net trade in converted paper and paperboard products, excluding printed materials.)

b) <u>adjusted waste paper net recovery rate:</u>

is the amount of waste paper collected as a percentage of the adjusted paper and paperboard consumption from which the non-recoverable paper and paperboard is deducted;

c) recovered paper utilization rate:

is the amount of recovered paper used for paper and paperboard as a percentage of paper and paperboard production;

c) <u>recovered paper in fibre use rate</u>:

is the amount of recovered paper used for paper and paperboard as a percentage of the total fibre used for paper and paperboard.

NOTE

The figures reported in this survey are the ones supplied by countries. As is apparent from some figures in the tables (consumption of recovered paper without any relation to paper production, unrealistic percentages, etc.), there is some misunderstanding in the definitions, and readers are urged to use caution when interpreting data from some countries.

WASTE PAPER RECOVERY

Most of the paper and paperboard consumed is theoretically available for re-utilization, with the exception of tissue papers, the highly contaminated and the permanently conserved papers.

Table 1-Non-recoverable paper and paperboard in 37 countries in 1997 and 1998 shows that for the 37 countries listed the amount of non-recoverable paper and paperboard expressed as a percentage of apparent paper and paperboard consumption varies between a low of 1 percent (Myanmar) and 46 percent in Malaysia in 1998.

Table 2 – Waste paper net recovery and adjusted waste paper net recovery rates in 28 countries in 1997 and 1998 indicates that both ratios were about a percentage point higher in 1998 than in 1997, 48 vs. 47 percent for waste paper net recovery rate and 56 vs. 54 percent for adjusted waste paper net recovery rate.

RECOVERED PAPER TRADE

Table 3 – Recovered paper trade in relation to waste paper collection and utilization in 37 countries in 1983, and Appendices 5 to 8 present the results of the survey.

The United States of America was the major exporter with over 7 million tons in 1998, followed by Germany with more than 3 million tons, and by the Netherlands and Belgium with over a million tons each.

As shown in Appendices 5 and 6, exports from the USA grew from 6.8 million tons in 1997 to 7.3 million tons in 1998. Total exports from the European Union grew from 7.4 to 7.7 million tons between 1997 and 1998. Japan's exports, though still small compared to the major exporters, registered an increase of 80 percent from their 1997 level of 311 000 tons.

Appendices 7 and 8 show imports of recovered paper and indicate that Canada and the Republic of Korea are the largest importers of recovered papers importing respectively 2.1 and 1.5 million tons in 1997, increasing to 2.2 and 2.0 million tons in 1998. In countries such as Canada, Mexico, Morocco, Republic of Korea, Pakistan and Thailand imports represent between 38 and 50 percent of the recovered paper used for paper and paperboard production, the numbers vary widely in Europe ranging from low of less than 1 percent in the United Kingdom to a high of 81 percent in Belgium.

RECOVERED PAPER UTILIZATION FOR PURPOSES OTHER THAN PAPER AND PAPERBOARD MAKING

Table 4 – Distribution of the total use of recovered paper between paper and paperboard uses and other uses gives the relevant information. Though data is often missing, the information collected from these 37 countries indicates that in most cases nearly all recovered paper is used for paper and paperboard production. From the lack of answer supplied to the question regarding incineration of recovered paper for energy generation, one could assume it does not amount to large volumes, or that the information is not recorded.

RECOVERED PAPER UTILIZATION BY THE PAPER AND PAPERBOARD INDUSTRY

The average recovered paper in fibre use rate was 48 percent in 1998 as shown in Table 5 – Recovered paper utilization rate, recovered paper in fibre use rate and total fibre used for paper and paperboard production, an increase of two percentage points from the level of 46 percent shown in the 1994 survey. The trend of increasing amounts of recovered paper being used in the paper furnish observed previously is continuing.

The recovered paper in fibre use rate (see page 2 for definition) varies widely from one country to another, ranging from lows around 10 percent, mostly in resources-rich countries such as Norway and Finland, to highs above 80 percent in countries such as Denmark, Mexico and Myanmar. A large majority of countries have rate between 30 and 60 percent. Figures superior to 100 percent either include fibre lost during processing or are erroneously reported by respondents.

The recovered paper utilization rate, representing how much recovered paper is used in the production of paper and paperboard, has an average value of 44 percent in 1998, compared with 40 percent in 1994. As in the past the ratio is low in fibre-rich countries, and high in fibre-poor regions.

Table 6 – Composition of recovered paper, shows what are the major grades of paper entering in the flow of recovered paper. On average world-wide, corrugated, solid containers and kraft sack waste account for nearly half of the total recovered paper while newspaper and magazines grades account for nearly a quarter of the total.

Table 7 – Use of recovered paper by grades shows in what percentage recovered paper is used in the production of various paper and paperboard grades. The data is more complete for 1998 than for 1997 and indicates that about 65 percent of the recovered paper is used in the production of packaging grades, while 20 percent goes in the production of newsprint and printing and writing grades.

LOSSES IN REPULPING OF WASTE PAPER

Waste paper has higher losses during pulping than virgin material, due to the amount of fines and filler in the waste paper. As the content of waste paper increases in the raw material, the amount of losses will go up.

Table 8 – Losses in repulping and processing into paper and paperboard presents the percentage figures for pulping losses. Though data is scarce, in most of the countries reporting the information, pulping losses are between 10 and 20 percent.

PROJECTED FUTURE RECOVERY OF WASTE PAPER

Table 9 – *Projected future recovery of waste paper and use of recovered paper for paper and paperboard making in 12 countries* shows projections for the next five years in both waste paper collected for re-use and for recovered paper used for paper and paperboard. They are expressed as a percentage of the 1998 level taken as a base line (100 percent).

APPENDIX 2: DEFINITIONS OF THE TERMS USED IN THE FAO WASTE PAPER SURVEY QUESTIONNAIRE

- 1. <u>Apparent consumption of paper and paperboard</u> is the quantity of paper and paperboard consumed within a country without taking into account the changes in stocks. It is thus paper and paperboard production within the country plus imports minus exports.
- 2. <u>Net trade in converted paper and paperboard products</u> (excluding printed material) is the difference between the imports and exports of converted paper and paperboard products [SITC (Rev. 2) 642 and part of BIN 48]. In case imports exceed exports, this factor is positive, and in case exports are higher than imports the factor is negative. This factor is used to adjust the apparent consumption of paper and paperboard in order to arrive at adjusted paper and paperboard consumption.
- 3. <u>Non-recoverable paper and paperboard</u> is the portion of adjusted paper and paperboard consumption which will not be <u>technically</u> available for recovery because of destruction, contamination or permanent conservation. In order to avoid having excessively long lists of all paper grades which are non-recoverable, only grades representing major quantities are listed below as examples.

4. <u>Waste paper collected for re-use</u> means the total quantity of waste paper collected from any sources of supply, in any form and for any kind of major industrial or commercial uses (including also other uses than paper and paperboard manufacturing). Broke, trimmings, tailings, etc., occurring in the paper manufacturing process cycle should, however, be excluded.

- 5. <u>Recovered paper used for energy generation</u> is the quantity of paper and paperboard sent to incineration plants which generate energy for any kind of use.
- 6. & 7. Exports and imports of recovered paper are the quantities of all kinds of waste paper exported and imported for any kind of use including waste paper market pulp² measured in terms of waste paper inputs.
- 8a. Recovered paper used domestically for purposes other than paper and paperboard making is the quantity of waste paper used for fibre building boards, moulded products, in bulk as wrapping and packaging material or for any other major industrial or commercial use.
- 8b. Recovered paper used domestically for paper and paperboard making is the net quantity of the waste paper intake at the mill (and excluding all sorting losses) of any kind of waste paper either locally collected or imported which is used exclusively in paper and paperboard manufacture including also recovered paper market pulp measured in terms of recovered paper input. (Whenever possible, the quantities of recovered paper should be expressed at 90 percent dryness and should include the losses in repulping and processing into paper and paperboard.) The details under this heading include the following:
 - i) Old and over-issue newspapers and magazines, telephone directories, brochures, etc., i.e. waste paper containing mainly mechanical pulp.

² Recovered paper market pulp is the pulp made of recovered paper for sale in the open market and does not include recovered paper pulp used in own plant or shipped to wholly owned or associated companies within the country. All recovered paper pulp moving outside the producing country is considered to be recovered paper market pulp.

- ii) Corrugated, solid container and kraft sack waste (old and new), i.e. recovered paper containing mainly unbleached sulphate pulp.
- iii) Wood-free printing and writing papers, copy paper, computer print-outs, and other high-grade qualities, i.e. recovered paper containing mainly bleached chemical pulp.
- iv) All other types of recovered paper.
- 9. <u>Losses in repulping and processing into paper and paperboard</u> is the quantity which is lost as broken fibres, fillers, coatings and other additives when the recovered paper is repulped, as well as the fibre losses in processing the derived recovered paper pulp into paper and paperboard.
- 10. <u>Total fibre used for paper and paperboard</u> is the total input quantity of all types of fibres at 90 percent dryness used for paper and paperboard manufacturing. The fibres can originate from wood (round, split, chips, residues, sawdust, etc.), from non-wood fibrous vegetable materials (bagasse, straw, bamboo, esparto, other reeds and grass, cotton linters, flax, hemp, etc.), from rags and other textile wastes and from recovered paper.
- 11. <u>Paper and paperboard production</u> is the quantity of all paper and paperboard of commercial quality (fibre building boards not included) produced within a country.

PLEASE NOTE: For some of the headings or for some parts of the headings the data might not be readily available. In such cases you are kindly requested to make estimates and to indicate such estimates with, e.g. a footnote.
