# IT'S A SOIL-BORNE FUNGUS THAT THREATENS THE FUTURE OF WORLDWIDE BANANA PRODUCTION

### FOLLOW ALL SECURITY RECOMMENDATIONS FROM YOUR LOCAL AUTHORITIES

### **DECLARE** all agricultural items **DO NOT BUY**

and bring home souvenirs made with any part of a banana plant

# follow basic biosecurity rules.

If they are not in place, follow them in any case and tell the farmer why

If it is **not possible** to follow basic biosecurity measures, refuse to visit the farm and tell the farmer why **REPORT** any suspected signs and symptoms consistent with TR4 sick plants to the National Plant **Protection Organization** (NPPO)



**FOLLOWING** 

the farm rules of growers is key to effective on-farm biosecurity



Clean and disinfect shoes. tools or machinery coming from regions where TR4 is present
