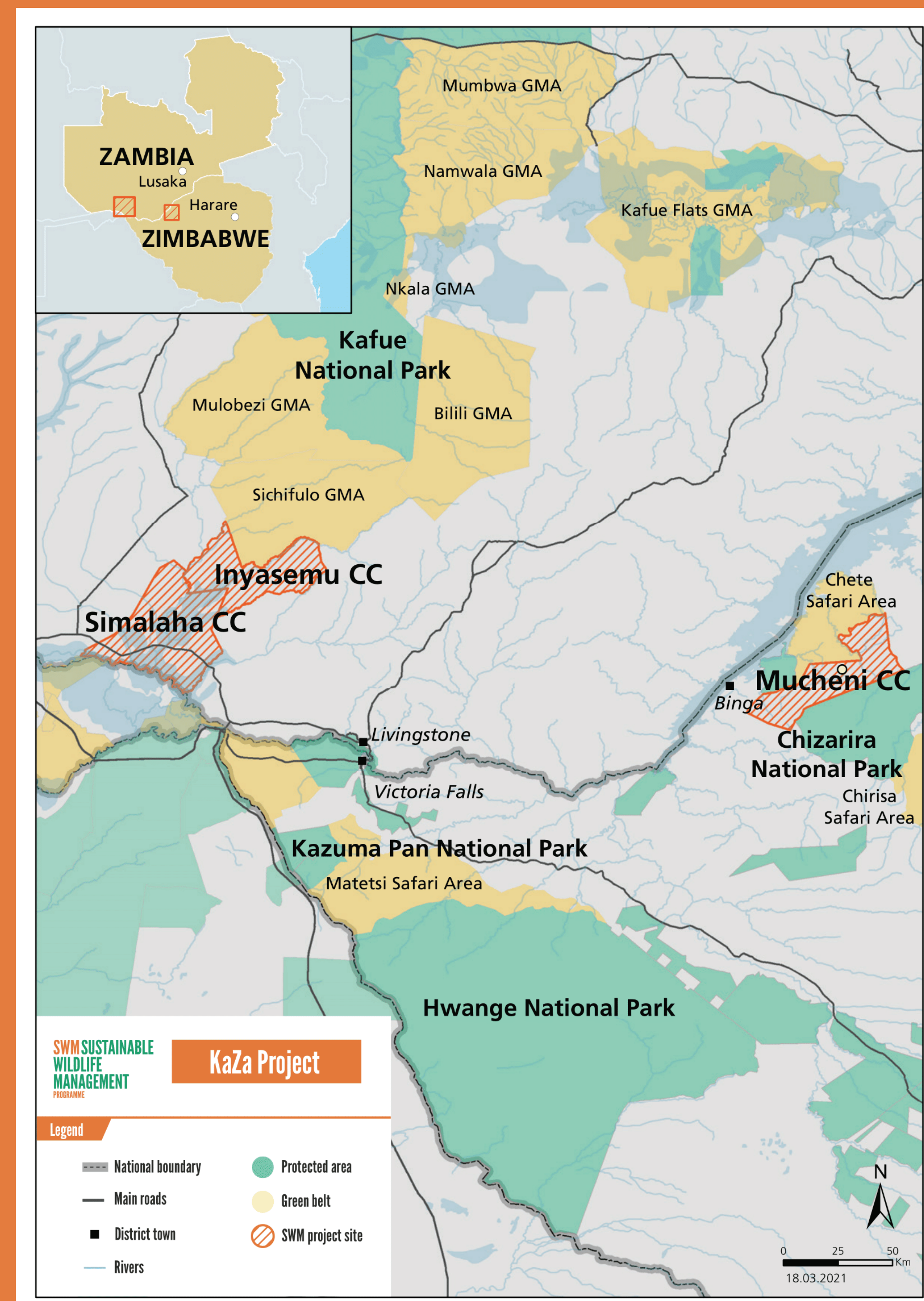
Zambia and Zimbabwe Kavango-Zambezi (KaZa) Project



The Kavango-Zambezi (KaZa) Project is supporting the establishment of three new community conservancies in Zimbabwe and Zambia. The sites are within the KaZa Transfrontier Conservation Area, the largest transboundary conservation area in the world.

In southern **Zambia**, the project activities are being implemented in Simalaha and Inyasemu community conservancies by the French Agricultural Research Center for International Development (CIRAD) and the Centre for International Forestry Research (CIFOR).

In **Zimbabwe**, the project activities are being implemented in the Mucheni conservancy by the French Agricultural Research Centre for International Development (CIRAD).
