

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EVALUATIONS



Évaluation du projet «Prévenir les conflits intercommunautaires et contribuer à la consolidation de la paix à travers le développement d'un pastoralisme résilient dans la zone transfrontalière de Diffa et du Kanem (Niger/Tchad)»

This evaluation finds that the establishment of Dimitra listeners' clubs in the Niger and Chad satisified people's need for dialogue on the transformations that their communities are experiencing. The project also improved the quality of relations between ethnic groups, and between host communities and displaced communities.

Asia and the Pacific – Regional Overview of Food Security and Nutrition 2021: Statistics and trends

An estimated 375.8 million people in Asia and the Pacific faced hunger in 2020, which is nearly 54 million more people than in 2019. In 2020, more than 1.1 billion people did not have access to adequate food – an increase of almost 150 million people in just one year.
