



# **IDENTIFICATION AND ANALYSIS OF** MARINE FISHERIES RESEARCH

Case studies from selected countries in the CECAF area of competence

The Aquatic Sciences and Fisheries Abstracts (ASFA) Secretariat collaborated with the Fishery Committee for the Eastern Central Atlantic (CECAF) to produce a regional inventory of marine fisheries research across selected CECAF and ASFA member countries from 2010 to 2020. With a team of international and national consultants, numerous research items ranging from journals, fisheries reports and other publication types have been recorded in the ASFA inventory. Further, ASFA performed bibliometric analysis to provide detailed insights of the fisheries research landscape across the CECAF region. This infographic presents a snapshot of the regional investigation and its results.







GHANA Results Summary .....

ASFA partners, Ghana's Fisheries Commission participated in the CECAF-PESCAO project aimed at identification and recording of marine fisheries research output by authors from Western Africa.

A combination of online sources (ASFA, Google Scholar, Scopus, Web of Science) and nationally held collections (libraries, institutional repositories or websites) were searched to identify research conducted by authors affiliated to institutions in Ghana.

Journal articles constitute **57** percent the all documents identified. A total of **169** journal articles, 41 books and monographs, 33 reports and 31 dissertations/thesis have been identified and are included in the inventory.



### Keywords

All publications were assigned one of 8 keywords. "Fishery management" and "Gender and Socioeconomic" aspects recorded the highest number of publications. "Ecosystem modelling" the lowest.


