INTRODUCTION

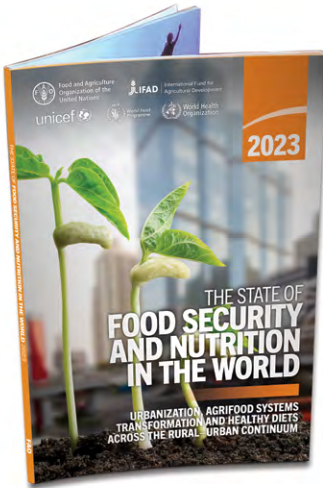
Only with knowledge can we free the world from hunger, malnutrition and poverty. According to the Basic Texts of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the Organization’s first function is to “collect, analyse, interpret and disseminate information relating to nutrition, food and agriculture”. FAO’s strategic focus on “the four betters” – better production, better nutrition, a better environment, and a better life – provide the roadmap guiding this work, within the broader perspective of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) agreed by the United Nations and the international community as part of the 2030 agenda.

FAO plays a unique role as a neutral forum, providing unbiased, high-quality information across all areas relating to food, agriculture and sustainable natural resources management. In 2022, FAO issued over 900 publications, ranging from authoritative analysis for policy makers and expert guidance for farmers to general knowledge for young people. Of these, an increasing number are now available in device-friendly formats. This catalogue includes a selection of the Organization’s most recent titles, as well as some older publications that have become references in their respective fields. In addition to English, numerous reports are available in Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian and Spanish.

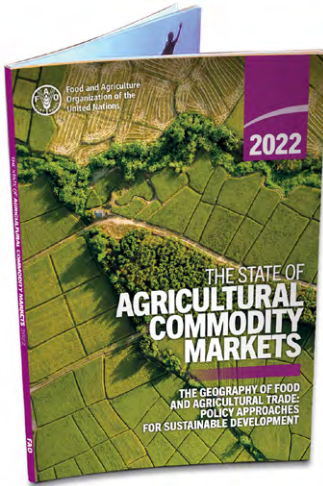

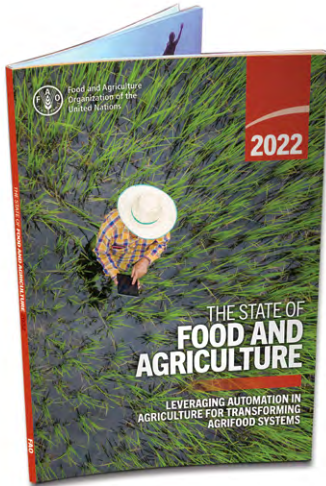
Published biennially, the series presents commodity market issues in an objective and accessible way to policy-makers, commodity market observers and stakeholders interested in these issues.

The State of Agricultural Commodity Markets 2022 (SOCO 2022) discusses how trade policies, based on both multilateral and regional approaches, can address today's challenges for sustainable development. Trade policies in food and agriculture should aim to safeguard global food security, address the trade-offs between economic and environmental objectives, and strengthen the resilience of the global agrifood system to shocks, such as conflicts, pandemics and extreme weather. The report discusses the geography of trade, analysing food and agricultural trade and its patterns across countries and regions, its drivers and the trade policy environment. Comparative advantage, trade policies and

trade costs shape the patterns of trade in food and agriculture. When comparative advantage plays out in the global market, trade benefits all countries. Lowering tariff barriers and reducing trade costs can promote trade and economic growth. Both multilateral and regional

trade agreements can facilitate the process of making trade an avenue for growth but the gains of trade are distributed unevenly. When global environmental impacts, such as climate change, are considered, a multilateral approach to trade can help expand the reach of mitigation measures.

The State of Food and Agriculture 2022 looks into the drivers of agricultural automation, including the more recent digital technologies. Based on 27 case studies, the report analyses the business case for adoption of digital automation technologies in different agricultural production systems across the world. It identifies several

barriers preventing inclusive adoption of these technologies, particularly by small-scale producers. Key barriers are low digital literacy and lack of an enabling infrastructure, such as connectivity and access to electricity, in addition to financial constraints. Based on the analysis, the publication suggests policies to ensure

that disadvantaged groups in developing regions can benefit from agricultural automation and that automation contributes to sustainable and resilient agrifood systems.

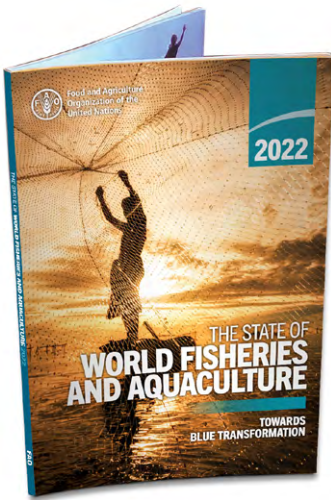
Against the backdrop of the Glasgow Leaders' Declaration on Forests and Land Use and the pledge of 140 countries to eliminate forest loss by 2030 and to support restoration and sustainable forestry, the 2022 edition of **The State of the World's Forests (SOFO)** explores green recovery and how to tackle multidimensional crises, including climate change and biodiversity loss. The proposed pathways involve halting deforestation and maintaining forests; restoring degraded lands and expanding agroforestry; and sustainably using forests and building green value chains. Their balanced, simultaneous pursuit can generate sustainable

economic and social benefits for countries and their rural communities, help sustainably meet increasing global demand for materials, and address environmental challenges. There is no time to lose to keep the

rise in global temperature below 1.5 °C, reduce the risk of future pandemics, ensure food security and nutrition for all, eliminate poverty, conserve biodiversity and offer young people hope of a better future.

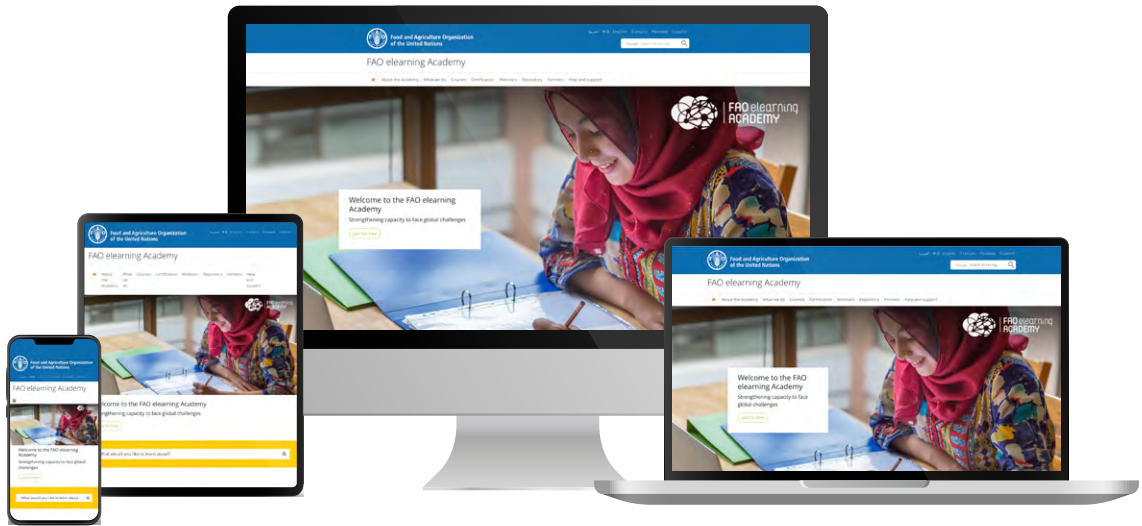
The 2022 edition of **The State of World Fisheries and Aquaculture** coincides with the launch of the Decade of Action to deliver the Global Goals, the United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development and the United Nations Decade

on Ecosystem Restoration. It presents how these and other equally important United Nations events, such as the International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture (IYAF 2022), are being integrated and supported through Blue Transformation, a priority area of

FAO's new Strategic Framework 2022–2031 designed to accelerate achievement of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in food and agriculture. The concept of Blue Transformation emerged from the Thirty-fourth Session of the FAO Committee on Fisheries in February 2021, and in particular the Declaration for Sustainable Fisheries and Aquaculture, which was negotiated and endorsed by all FAO Members. The Declaration calls for support for “an evolving and positive vision for fisheries and aquaculture in the twenty-first century, where the sector is fully recognized for its contribution to fighting poverty, hunger and malnutrition.”

The Academy uses the “Digital Badges Certification System”, to certify the acquisition of competencies, in order to **progress talents** within organizations and **increase employment opportunities**.

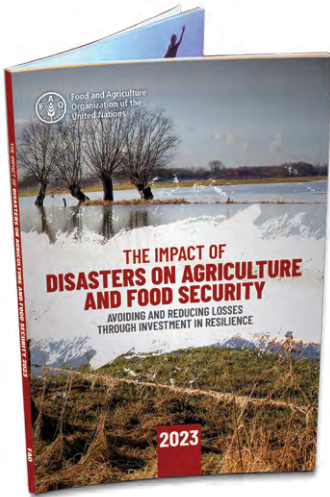

Disasters are resulting in unprecedented levels of destruction across the world. These shocks and disruptions affect the functioning and sustainability of agricultural production and threaten the livelihoods of millions of people reliant on agrifood systems. Reducing the impact of disasters in agriculture requires a better understanding of the extent to which these events produce

negative impacts in agriculture and necessitates an investigation into the underlying risks that make agriculture vulnerable to the effects of disasters. This report provides an assessment of losses caused by disasters in agricultural production over the past three decades and delves into the diverse threats and impacts affecting the crops, livestock, forestry, and fisheries

and aquaculture subsectors. These impacts are amplified by underlying factors and vulnerabilities created by social and environmental conditions such as climate change, global pandemics and conflict situations, which can generate disastrous outcomes and produce cascading effects across agrifood systems. Facing up to these challenges demands new approaches to risk reduction and response mechanisms. This publication provides examples of actions and strategies for investing in resilience and proactively addressing risks in agriculture. It demonstrates ways to mainstream disaster risk into agricultural practices and policies and calls for a deeper understanding of the context in which these solutions are implemented.

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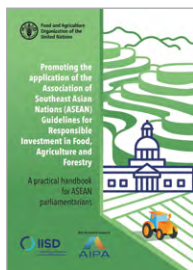


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This publication uses complex simulations to estimate the direct and indirect impact of the pandemic in agricultural settings. In the process, it reveals the severity of the fallout of lockdowns on rural households.

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This study shows how beef and dairy expansion creates demand for additional land, which, combined with existing land constraints, increases risk of further deforestation. It also proposes possible entry points for developing deforestation-free value chains.

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Automation and digitalization hold great promise for small-scale agricultural producers in low- and middle-income countries, and for the greater global aim of ending hunger. But this ten-country study found mostly "disembodied solutions" – a fair penetration of mobile devices and crop-focused apps, but little in the way of integrated platforms or an enabling environment.

As providers of crucial ecosystem and socioeconomic benefits and services, forests are high on the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
