Things to help your pigs avoid African swine fever infection



Keep my space clean

It is important to remove all organic matter prior to disinfection.

Remove dirt and grime. Scrub using detergent and water.



Disinfect frequently

African swine fever virus can remain for long periods in blood, faeces, secretions and animal tissue.

Regularly clean and disinfect farm premises and all equipment.



Give me space

Densely populated herds can increase the risk of animal disease transmission.

Avoid overcrowding in pens.



Segregate

Limit the frequency of introduction of new pigs into the exisitng herd.

New arrivals should be isolated in a different pen or area.



Keep others out

Prohibit visitors and unauthorized personnel into the pens.

Visitors can spread the virus through contaminated shoes and clothings.

Swill could be contaminated with virus.

If you use swill, cook it thoroughly



Restrict movements

Movement of potentially infected pigs and contaminated products from infected zones can spread animal diseases.



Be in the know

Stay well-informed to protect your animals.

Be on alert and know the status of diseases in your area.



No swill for me

with frequent stirring.

Report unusual events

If you observe anything unusual in your animals, report to veterinary authorities.

The earlier you report, the more you can save.
