Improving hatchery and parent flock management practices in Viet Nam

✓ **Project objective**

To reduce the risk of disease transmission and enhance food safety by improving hatchery and parent flock farm biosecurity

✓ **Project donor**

World Poultry Foundation (WPF)

Poultry breeder farms and hatcheries are important nodes in the poultry production chain. Poor biosecurity in these facilities not only reduces the quality and quantity of day-old birds produced, but also contributes to the spread of pathogens, causes environmental pollution, and affects workers' health.

Information provided by the Viet Nam Department of Livestock Production (DLP) shows that over 80% of the poultry breeder farms and hatcheries do not properly implement biosecurity measures. While Viet GAHP (Good Animal Husbandry Practices) issued by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (MARD) provide official guidance to industrial farms, they are not suitable for small and medium scale poultry breeder farms and hatcheries.

Therefore, FAO ECTAD Viet Nam and the DLP developed a set of biosecurity guidelines for small and medium scale poultry parent flock farms and hatcheries. These guidelines

were tested in 12 pilot farms in Quang Tri and Can Tho Provinces in Viet Nam during a previous USAID-funded project. Farmers were able to witness an impressive change in their businesses and working environment while protecting their flocks against diseases including Avian Influenza.

With the financial aid from World Poultry Foundation (WPF), 10 hatchery training experts in Viet Nam were identified by FAO and DLP to effectively disseminate these biosecurity standards. These hatchery training Experts have excellent knowledge on proper management of small and medium scale hatcheries and parent flock farms and they have been selected through a rigorous training and evaluation process developed by FAO ECTAD Viet Nam and DLP-MARD. The hatchery training experts will also serve as technical mentors to farmers and workers and continuously communicate with them for further supervision and providing feedback.
