Membership of the WFP Executive Board

Suggested Action by the Council

In accordance with FAO Conference Resolution 7/2011, the Council is required to elect six FAO Member Nations to the WFP Executive Board for a term of office of three years (1 January 2021 - 31 December 2023) to fill the following seats:

- 1 seat from List A
- 2 seats from List C
- 2 seats from List D
- 1 seat from List E

The attached nomination form should be completed and signed by Member Nations wishing to stand for the above seats and submitted to the Secretary-General of the Conference and Council as a scanned copy by email to FAO-Council@fao.org by **12.00 hours on Monday, 23 November 2020.**

1. For purposes of election to the Board, FAO Member Nations are divided into five separate lists (A, B, C, D and E)* as shown on the FAO Council Web page under "Additional Information": [\[http://www.fao.org/about/meetings/council/cl165/documents/en/\]](http://www.fao.org/about/meetings/council/cl165/documents/en/).
2. The Council is required to elect six members for a term of office expiring on 31 December 2023 to replace the ones whose term ends on 31 December 2020, i.e. Algeria (A), Brazil (C), Denmark (D), Equatorial Guinea (A), Norway (D) and Poland (E). It should be noted that the Rotating Seat occupied by List A for the period 2018-20 will pass to List C for the period 2021-23.
3. Outgoing members are eligible for re-election.
4. A nomination form is given in *Appendix A*.

¹ At the 163rd FAO Council held on 5 December 2019, the Council was informed that Belgium and Ireland would resign their seats effective 31 December 2019, with Denmark and Norway completing their respective terms from 1 January 2020 to 31 December 2020.

² The rotating seat is to be occupied by a country of: List A Third Term 2018/2019/2020, held by Equatorial Guinea; and List C Fourth Term 2021/2022/2023.

³ Nigeria and Côte d'Ivoire reached an agreement to share an FAO Council-elected seat, with Nigeria serving in 2019 and Côte d'Ivoire serving in 2020 and 2021.

⁴ Afghanistan and India reached an agreement to share an FAO Council-elected seat, with Afghanistan serving in 2019 and India serving in 2020 and 2021.

⁵ Kuwait and Afghanistan reached an agreement to share an FAO Council-elected seat, with Kuwait serving in 2019 and 2020 and Afghanistan serving in 2021.

⁶ Mexico and Peru reached an agreement to share an FAO Council-elected seat, with Mexico serving in 2019 and Peru serving in 2020 and 2021.

⁷ The Economic and Social Council, by its decision 2020/205 of 3 April 2020, authorized the President of the Council to hold elections under a silence procedure process when, in the President's view, a plenary meeting of the Council is not practical due to the coronavirus pandemic. The ECOSOC Bureau further decided to hold elections to fill vacancies in Council subsidiary bodies for which the number of candidatures are equal to or less than the number of vacancies to be filled for all the regional categories through a two-step silence procedure process. Accordingly, the Council took the following action effective 21 April 2020 and elected Italy, by acclamation, to the Executive Board for a term beginning on 1 January and expiring on 31 December 2021, to replace Austria which was resigning its seat effective 31 December 2020.

⁸ Angola and South Africa reached an agreement to share an FAO Council elected seat, with Angola serving from 1 January 2020 until 31 December 2021 and South Africa from 1 January 2022 until 31 December 2022.

⁹ Argentina and Dominican Republic reached an agreement to share an FAO Council elected seat, with Argentina serving from 1 January 2020 until 31 December 2020 and Dominican Republic from 1 January 2021 until 31 December 2022.
