Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) is going to elect its next Director-General at the 43rd Session of its Conference in July 2023. Pursuant to Rule XXXVII paragraph one of the FAO General Rules, I am honored to advise you of the decision made by the government of the People's Republic of China to nominate Qu Dongyu, the current FAO Director-General, as a candidate for this post.

Food security is critical to human survival. It is an important part of implementing the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. China attaches great importance to issues related to rural areas, agriculture and rural population, and prioritizes the development of agriculture and rural areas. It has won the largest battle against poverty in human history, lifting nearly 100 million poor rural residents out of poverty and attaining, 10 years ahead of schedule, the poverty reduction target under the 2030 Agenda. China has reinforced the foundations for food security on all fronts, feeding one-fifth of the world's population with less than nine percent of the world's arable land. In the meantime, China has actively shared with fellow developing countries its experience in food, agriculture and poverty reduction, and provided assistance to the best of its capacity. It has demonstrated its sense of responsibility as a major country for enhancing global food security and advancing sound and sustainable development of global agriculture. Over the past one year and more, China has pressed ahead with implementing the Global Development Initiative (GDI) put forth by President Xi Jinping, focusing on poverty reduction and food security as two priorities in GDI cooperation. China has also initiated the Food Production Enhancement Action and officially launched Phase III of the

China-FAO South-South Cooperation Trust Fund totaling US\$50 million, in a bid to build a world free from hunger and poverty with concrete actions.

These endeavors have produced positive outcomes in helping developing countries reduce poverty and build capacity for ensuring food security. Director-General Qu is thus highly recognized by the international community for his pragmatism, professionalism and diligence.

Mr. Secretary-General, by nominating Director-General Qu Dongyu as a candidate in the forthcoming election, China wishes to demonstrate its support to the FAO and to the United Nations, its commitment to ensuring global food security and implementing the 2030 Agenda, and its sense of responsibility for improving the global food governance system. The Chinese government is convinced that Director-General Qu will discharge his functions efficiently and lead the FAO in its endeavors on all fronts to make even greater contributions to accelerating progress toward the 2030 Agenda and achieving stronger, greener and healthier global development.
