Activities:

- 1. Developing a Memorandum of Understanding (on operating plans):
 - a. Mexico and Canada signed the Operating Plan in 2021 and 2022.
 - b. Mexico and USA signed the Operating Plan in 2022.
 - c. Canada and USA signed an updated Memorandum of Understanding in 2023.
- 2. North American Fire Science Blueprint:
 - a. Completed working document drafts on mapping the wildfire science landscape, challenges facing wildfire science and research gaps identified in the literature.
 - b. Completed the first round of pilot interviews with European fire stakeholders on science gaps, needs, and foresighting, which has informed the working group's protocol development.
 - c. Obtained ethics approval for the full phase of interviews.

d. Currently finalizing recruitment lists for interviews across Canada, the Unites States of America and Mexico beginning autumn 2023.

- 3. North American Study Tour:
 - a. The delayed Australia-New Zealand Study Tour was held virtually in May 2023.
 - b. The North American Study Tour is expected to be held in-person in 2024.
- 4. North American Study Tour Mentoring Focus Group:
 - a. There have been 11 sessions in preparation of the initiative to create a Mentoring Focus Group to exchange experience and knowledge.
- 5. International Training Support, including Latin and South American countries:
 - a. In 2022, Mexico and the USA carried out the activity "HOT SHOT Technical exchange" in which three Mexican firefighters traveled for two months to California to work with the Kern Valley Hotshot Crew. This activity is a result of the collaboration between CONAFOR and USFS.
 - b. In 2023, Mexico and the USA carried out the activity "HOT SHOT Technical exchange" in which two Mexican firefighters traveled for two and a half months to California to work with the Kern Valley Hotshot Crew. This activity is a result of the collaboration between CONAFOR and USFS.
 - c. Canada is in ongoing discussions with Costa Rica to develop capacity in water application and crew leadership.
