**Report on the Utilization of WFP's Advance Financing Mechanisms
(1 January – 31 December 2013)**

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- On-time delivery of food to beneficiaries is crucial for WFP's operations. Advance financing means allocating funds to a project using forecast contributions as collateral. WFP's advance financing mechanisms are the Immediate Response Account (IRA) and the Working Capital Financing Facility (WCFF).

IRA

- The IRA, established in December 1991 by the forerunner of the Executive Board, is a multilateral funding facility that enables WFP to provide immediate assistance in emergencies, including logistics and non-food costs. The current target level is USD70 million.
- The IRA proved its value in 2013 by enabling WFP to respond immediately to situations that demand rapid injections of resources. Allocations from the IRA in 2013 amounted to USD165.3 million which was allocated to start and support 46 relief operations – 18 protracted relief and recovery operations (PRROs), three special operation (SO) and 25 emergency operations (EMOPs); of the latter, 10 were immediate-response EMOPs approved under the delegated authority of Country Directors, Regional Directors and the Director of Emergencies.

WCF

- The Executive Board approved a WCFF ceiling of USD180 million in January 2005, following successful pilot schemes, and subsequently increased the facility ceiling in October 2010 to USD557 million. This enabled the Executive Director to ensure that projects continued to receive advance funding pending confirmation of forecast contributions, within established risk-management parameters.
- In 2013, advances totalling USD675.2 million were made from the Working Capital Facility. 67.1 percent of this funding was advanced to EMOPs, 17.3 percent to PRROs, 7.1 percent to development projects and country programmes, 2.4 percent to SOs and 6.1 percent to corporate services.
- Under the WCFF, the Forward Purchase Facility (FPF) was established in June 2008 with a pilot allocation from the WCF. On the basis of the successful pilot, in 2010 the Board approved use of up to USD150 million for allocation to the FPF. In view of increasing demand reflecting the value of the new approach, in June 2012 the Board approved a further increase of the FPF allocation from the WCF from USD150 million to USD300 million. An additional USD50 million was approved by the Executive Board in November 2013, earmarked for surge capacity in the supply chain.
- WFP's forward-purchase mechanisms enabled it to buy nearly 955,000 mt of food in 2013, of which 873,000 mt had been procured by projects in more than 30 country offices. Lead times were reduced by an average of two-and-a-half months, a 71 percent improvement.



DRAFT DECISION*



The Board takes note of “Report on the Utilization of WFP’s Advance Financing Mechanisms (1 January–31 December 2013)” (WFP/EB.A/2014/6-K/1).

INTRODUCTION

1. On-time delivery of food to beneficiaries is crucial for WFP's operations. In the last decade WFP has developed its advance financing mechanisms with a view to improving operational effectiveness and efficiency, and in particular the timeliness of food deliveries to beneficiaries.
2. Advance financing means allocating funds to a project using forecast contributions as collateral. Once the collateral is confirmed, the project repays the advance. This enables country offices to reduce the lead-time from a donor's expression of interest in contributing to an operation to delivery of food to beneficiaries. WFP's advance financing mechanisms are the Immediate Response Account (IRA) and the Working Capital Financing Facility (WCFF).

Immediate Response Account

3. The IRA, established in December 1991 by the forerunner of the Executive Board, is a multilateral funding facility that enables WFP to provide immediate assistance in emergencies, including logistics and non-food costs. The current target level, set in 2004, is USD 70 million.
4. The IRA serves as a replenishable fund and a revolving fund. It is replenished by donors' direct contributions (see Annex I). The term "revolving" means that funds allocated from the IRA to an operation may subsequently be reimbursed using donors' contributions received for that operation. Contributions that are used for this purpose are accounted for and reported under the operation to which they were pledged.
5. Allocations from the IRA (see Annex II) are loaned to operations in anticipation of donors' contributions. If no donations are received the loan may be regarded as a permanent non-reimbursable grant from the IRA.

Working Capital Financing Facility

6. The Board approved a WCFF ceiling of USD 180 million in January 2005 following successful pilot schemes, and increased the ceiling in October 2010 to USD 557 million. This enabled the Executive Director to ensure that projects continued to receive advance funding pending confirmation of forecast contributions within established risk-management parameters.
7. The WCFF has become an essential tool for efficient project implementation. By 2008, demand had grown significantly as contribution forecasts improved and as country offices became more familiar with the process. The Forward Purchase Facility (FPF), piloted in 2008 in the Horn of Africa and southern Africa, operates with various funds including those from the WCFF but food is not released to projects until they have confirmed contributions or forecast contributions advanced using the WCFF or IRA.

IMMEDIATE RESPONSE ACCOUNT

8. As a flexible funding mechanism, the IRA enables WFP to respond proactively to impending emergencies.
9. The IRA proved its value in 2013 by enabling WFP to respond immediately to situations that demand rapid injections of resources. Allocations from the IRA in 2013 were 31 percent higher than in 2012 with USD 165.3 million allocated to start and support 46 relief operations – 18 protracted relief and recovery operations (PRROs), 3 special operations and 25 emergency operations (EMOPs); of the EMOPs 10 were immediate-response EMOPs approved under the delegated authority of Country Directors, Regional Directors and the Director of Emergencies.

10. In 2013 significant support was provided for the Syrian regional emergency response, and for food-insecure vulnerable groups in the Niger and Somalia. Operations receiving multiple IRA allocations were EMOPs in the Central African Republic, the Philippines, South Sudan and the Syrian Arab Republic; and PRROs in Kenya, Niger and Somalia.
11. Ten immediate-response EMOPs were approved in 2013 (15 in 2012) with a total value of USD 9.6 million (USD 13.4 million in 2012). In 2013, the IRA also supported emergency preparedness and needs assessments for emerging situations in eight countries valued at USD 1.4 million; in 2012 such support had been given in eight countries at a cost of USD 1.1 million.
12. In 2013 there was a decrease of USD 4.1 million – 7 percent – in new contributions to the IRA when compared with 2012. However, the level of allocations increased by USD 39.2 million – 31 percent (see Annex III). When an advance from the IRA is requested, allocations are made against funds in the account; the availability of funding depends on the timing of new contributions and of advances being repaid. The balance available in 2013 was rarely sufficient to allow large allocations even though the number of allocations was the same as in 2011.
13. At the end of 2013, the IRA balance stood at USD 14.1 million, compared with USD 38.7 million at the end of 2012.

WORKING CAPITAL FINANCING FACILITY

14. In 2013, advances totalling USD 675.2 million were made from the WCFF (see Table 2). There were 120 loans totalling USD 618.2 million made to 62 operations. Two loans totalling USD 16.15 million were made to 12 operations against anticipated multilateral contributions. Eight advances totalling USD 35.8 million were made in 2013 for security, telecommunications, evaluation and the food-security cluster; the FPF received two advances totalling USD 21.2 million. In terms of operations, 67.1 percent of this funding was advanced to EMOPs, 17.3 percent to PRROs, 7.1 percent to development projects and country programmes, 2.4 percent to special operations and 6.1 percent to corporate services.

15. Advances from the WCFF totalling USD 100 million enabled the country offices in Chad, South Sudan and the Sudan to pre-position food before the rainy season. Support funds totalling USD 56.7 million were advanced to country offices in the Sahel. Operations for the Syrian crisis received advances of USD 233.2 million to assist refugees and displaced people. Advances totalling USD 91.5 million went to Ethiopia, the Philippines, the Sudan and Yemen to avert pipeline breaks. It was not possible to make any other advances because the limit for WCFF was approached at key points in the year.

FORWARD PURCHASE FACILITY

16. The FPF is a special account established in June 2008 with a pilot allocation of USD 60 million from the WCFF to implement a forward purchase approach. From then until July 2010, WFP utilized the funds to purchase 440,000 mt of cereals and pulses valued at USD 128 million. On the basis of the successful pilot, in 2010 the Board approved use of up to USD 150 million for allocation to the FPF.
17. In view of increasing demand reflecting the value of the new approach, in June 2012 the Board approved an increase of the FPF allocation from the WCFF from USD 150 million to USD 300 million. At EB.2/2013, the Board approved a further USD 50 million to meet any sudden surge in supply chain needs in an emergency.

18. The main objective of the FPF is to improve efficiency and effectiveness in responding to beneficiary needs by:

- accelerating food deliveries through anticipation of the supply process;
- enabling WFP to exploit favourable market conditions; and
- reducing response times in emergencies.

Highlights in 2013

19. Forward purchases of food amounted to 955,000 mt in 2013, with an average of 342,000 mt available for forward purchase throughout the year. Thirty country offices bought 873,000 mt of food from the FPF inventory, with an average lead-time of two and half months, an improvement of 71 percent over the lead-time needed under the conventional procurement process.
20. Almost 80 percent of the food purchased for the East Africa supply line – 477,000 mt – was delivered to country offices through FPF, with an average lead-time of 19 days as opposed to the average of 108 days needed under the conventional purchase process.
21. Half of food purchased by countries in the West Africa supply line – 128,000 mt – was delivered through FPF, with an average lead-time of 20 days as opposed to the average 104-day lead-time under the conventional process.
22. The North Africa and Middle East supply line, established in December 2012, delivered 210,000 mt of food for the Syrian crisis. This represented 72 percent of the total food delivered to the operations, reducing the average lead-time to 25 days.
23. The FPF supply line in southern Africa, established in May 2013, provided 58,000 mt of food – 60 percent of the total purchased from May to December – with an average lead-time of 37 days, as opposed to the average of lead-time of 120 days under the conventional process.
24. Storing WFP food at forward positioning locations resulted in further efficiencies, as consignment storage beyond the free storage periods was kept to a minimum. The improved efficiencies and increased alignment between the global FPF supply and operational demand was a result of increases in the capital available for FPF supply lines and larger amounts of food in the FPF supply line purchased and delivered on time to country offices.

Challenges

⇒ *Donor visibility*

25. When food for WFP operations is purchased through traditional means, donor visibility requests can usually be accommodated, for example by ordering in bags marked with a donor name or logo. To save time and money, an alternative is partial consignment marking using up to 20,000 new donor bags per 10,000 mt of food.
26. These visibility options are more difficult to apply to FPF consignments, which are ordered ahead of donations and dispatched quickly from central locations once funding is available for projects. Where marking is to be undertaken, a faster and less expensive option is to place donor tags on bags or stickers on boxes, with a maximum of 20,000 tags or stickers per 10,000 mt.
27. With FPF consignments accounting for an increasing proportion of total WFP purchases, more efficient options for donor visibility are being sought. Proposed options include: placing banners with donor logos at distribution sites; including photographs of

donor-marked bags in WFP publications; issuing press releases; and undertaking public relations campaigns. WFP will always opt for the approach that provides the highest value for donor contributions and ensures timely delivery to beneficiaries.

⇒ *Business process and systems revisions*

28. The FPF has changed the way in which WFP manages food transfers with cross-cutting effects on its operational and financial processes that require changes in its information systems. The information technology solution designed to integrate business process changes was implemented in 2013.
