

Comments of IUFoST

Agenda item 3a add.1: MATTERS RELATED TO AZODICARBONAMIDE (INS 927A)

IUFoST would like to thank the Codex Secretariat for preparing the document and offers the following comments:

Based on JECFA's decision to withdraw the ADI for azodicarbonamide (INS 927a), IUFoST supports the deletion of the provision for azodicarbonamide (INS 927a) from the GSFA, which constitutes a consequential procedural action. It is noteworthy that the ADI withdrawal is attributed to the age of the previous evaluation, dating back to 1965, and to the fact that members and observers of Codex did not express interest for a JECFA re-evaluation.

IUFoST would like to emphasize the importance of the alignment of Codex provisions stemming from Commodity Committees and the General Subject Committees. IUFoST supports every effort to promote such alignment with the referral of food additive provisions (including processing aids) to be included in Commodity Standards to the CCFA for review and endorsement.

As highlighted by the working document, the review of standard texts revealed various inconsistencies and ambiguities. IUFoST supports all efforts aiming to prevent confusion and recommends pursuing this alignment exercise, with the consideration of proposed modifications in the food categories and additive provisions, as well as addressing possible contradictions between existing notes to achieve coherence.

IUFoST would like to thank China, France, Japan, Türkiye and the Confederation of European Yeast Producers for the efforts deployed in the preparation of this discussion paper.

Yeast is an essential ingredient, widely used in daily food preparation given its beneficial effects in food technology (preparation of bread and its derived products which are highly consumed in several regions worldwide).

The new work proposed for the development of a standard for yeast is needed to harmonize the production approaches, to protect consumer health, and promote fair practices in the international food trade.

IUFoST encourages further discussion during the committee meeting, with the regards to the way the standard ought to be formulated. IUFoST encourages the creation of a working group that will pursue the work of the development of this standard, consistent with CCFA guidelines.
