

# 2. **REGISTRATION**

The participants of the meeting should provide the relevant information through the online registration system (<a href="http://www.codexalimentarius.org/login">http://www.codexalimentarius.org/login</a>). The participants will have to complete the mandatory second part of the registration procedure at the registration desk. The registration desk will be located outside the meeting venue. Participants will be expected to finish this procedure on *Friday 17 March and Saturday 18 March from 08:00 to 16:00 and from 08:00 on Monday 20 March 2017*.

# 3. ACCOMMODATION

- b) A limited number of rooms in Holiday Inn are blocked at special discounted rates for the participants of Codex Committee on Food Additives (CCFA). The special discounted rates will only apply to those reservations made before *10 February*, *2017* (Friday) on a first come, first served basis.

### 4. LUNCH AND DINNER ARRANGEMENTS

### 5. GETTING TO THE MEETING VENUE (CONRAD MACAO)

#### A. By Sands Cotai Central Shuttle Buses

Sands Cotai Central provides free shuttle bus service from different transport hubs to Conrad Macao, details as follows:

#### Macao International Airport

Sands Cotai Central Shuttle Buses depart every 15 to 20 minutes from Macao International Airport to Sands Cotai Central, from 10:00 to 22:30. Walk toward the north exit of the airport and walk out into the parking lot.

#### > Macao Ferry Terminal

Sands Cotai Central Shuttle Buses depart every 10 to 20 minutes from Macao Ferry Terminal to Sands Cotai Central, where the meeting venue is located, from 9:00 to 00:00.

#### Taipa Ferry Terminal

Sands Cotai Central Shuttle Buses depart every 5 to 15 minutes from Taipa Ferry Terminal to Sands Cotai Central. Schedule of shuttle buses as follows:

Taipa Ferry to Sands Cotai Central: 07:30-01:00

Overnight: 01:20-01:40/02:20-02:40

#### Gongbei-Macao Border Gate

Sands Cotai Central Shuttle Buses depart every 15 to 20 minutes from Gongbei-Macao Border Gate to Sands Cotai Central, from 9:00 to 00:00.

### 6. GETTING TO MACAO

### A. From Hong Kong International Airport to Macao SAR

#### Option 1:

An airport route for transferring participants to Macao is provided from Hong Kong International Airport's SkyPier to Macao Peninsula and Taipa (an island of Macao). At Arrivals Level of Terminal 1, transferring participants must purchase the tickets and present baggage tag receipts at the Ferries to Mainland/ Macao Ticketing Counter at Transfer Area E2. No immigration and baggage claim procedures are required. Sailing time is about 70 minutes. Fare is about 254 Hong Kong dollars (HK\$). This service is provided by two ferry operators.

#### Option 2:

If the sailing schedule of Hong Kong International Airport's SkyPier Transfer Ferry Service cannot meet your schedule, you can take a ferry from the Hong Kong-Macao Ferry Terminal in Shun Tak Centre. It is located above the Sheung Wan Mass Transit Railway (MTR) station. Ferries depart regularly to Macao Peninsula and Taipa from there, provided by two operators. Sailing time is about 55 minutes. Fares range from HK\$153 to HK\$189.

# There are two main options of transportation between Hong Kong International Airport and Shun Tak Centre:

#### **By The Airport Express**

The Airport Express takes participants from the airport to Central MTR Station in just 24 minutes. It is the fastest link to the city. The Airport Express Customer



Service is immediately after Customs. Trains depart at about 10-minute intervals from 05:54 to 23:28 and approximately 12-minute intervals from 23:28 to 00:48 daily. Fare is about HK\$100.

Taxi and MTR services are available from Central MTR Station to Sheung Wan MTR station. Taxi fare is around HK\$30 and MTR fare is around HK\$5. The journey takes around 7 minutes.

#### By Taxi

Take a Red Taxi from Hong Kong International Airport to the Hong Kong-Macao Ferry Terminal. Fare is about HK\$300 and takes 30 minutes.



#### B. From Shenzhen Airport to Macao/ Taipa Ferry

Regular ferry services are available from Shenzhen Airport to Macao Ferry Terminal from 9:00 to 20:00 and to Taipa Ferry Terminal at 8:10, 10:30 and 13:30 (three connections only). Sailing time is approximately 60 minutes. Fare is \$235 Patacas (MOP).

# 9. LANGUAGE

Being a former Portuguese territory, Macao SAR has two official languages; Chinese and Portuguese. The Chinese language is more widely spoken and English is generally spoken to some extent.

### **10.CURRENCY**

Macao SAR's currency is the Pataca (MOP) and the exchange rate to US Dollar is around 8 Patacas to 1 US Dollar.

### 11.WEATHER

During the month of March the average temperature is around 20°C (68°F) while humidity is around 80%.

# 12. ELECTRICITY

Electricity in Macao SAR is at 230V, 50Hz. The power plugs used are of the three-pin square-shaped.



### 13.LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

Since Macao was founded in the mid-16th century, it had been an entrepot of China's foreign trade over the centuries and a stepping stone of Western Catholicism to set foot in China. Being steeped in history and cultural diversity, the city is as vibrant as ever with its ceaseless mingling and interaction between Oriental and Occidental cultures. On 15 July, 2005, the Historical Centre of Macao that revolves around the city's old town area was inscribed into the World Heritage List to mark Macao's historical and cultural importance. By today, it boasts a multitude of attractions, be it the past or present.

# Ruins of St. Paul's Cathedral



The Ruins of St. Paul's Cathedral is the most important landmark of Macao featuring a grand stairway and a magnificently imposing structure richly adorned by elaborated sculptures and exquisite motifs. The intricacy of its history is a fascinating fact that contributes to its fame. It was a church attached to St. Paul's College, the

first Western university in the Far East, which had suffered three disastrous fires. All its internal structures were burnt down leaving nothing but its facade that seemed to have the blessings of God for its survival.

### **Holy House of Mercy**

Founded in 1569 by D. Belchior Carneiro, first Bishop of Macao, the Holy House of Mercy is a charitable organization devoted to provision of relief to the impoverished. It used to run a hospital, foundling homes, a leprosarium, elderly homes and orphanages.



### The Civic and Municipal Affairs Bureau (IACM) Head Office



Located at Senado Square, the head office where the Civic and Municipal Affairs Bureau (IACM) is seated nowadays is one of the oldest and most important public buildings of Macao. The building has a long history of more than a few hundred years and was once used as the

Municipal Museum, the Department of Health, the Judicial Courts, post office and prison. As one of the historic buildings of the "Historic Centre of Macao," it was accepted into the exclusive UNESCO World Heritage List in 2005. The building has undertaken the mission to serve the public of Macao until the present day.

# St. Dominic's Church

Located at Largo de São Domingos, the Church is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. It was constructed in haste by the Dominicans in 1587 simply with wooden planks and an erected cross as a small chapel for they were tight on funding and



constrained by time. When more ample funding became available, quality timber were imported to turn it into a decent church. By 1828, Spanish priests proficient in architecture helped out in the church's reconstruction to shape its present look.

## A-Má Temple


Located at the southwest tip of Macao Peninsula, it is the oldest amongst the three historical temples of Macao. The four main buildings of A-Ma Temple are the Prayer Hall, the Hall of Benevolence, Hall of Kun Iam (Goddess of Mercy) and Zhengjiao Chanlin (a Buddhist pavilion).



Allegedly, the temple was constructed by a merchant of Fujian who was on a boat journey to Macao. A deadly rainstorm struck on the way and Mazu made her power felt to save everyone in the boat. In gratitude to the goddess for saving his life, the merchant built this temple to venerate her presence. He also made a carving of a boat at sea on a huge rock in front of the hall to mark the construction. The flag of the boat bears the Chinese characters, "利涉大川", to imply smooth sailing.
