### **REGISTRATION AND IDENTIFICATION BADGES**

Participants are invited to pre-register before 17 March 2023 using the Online Registration System (ORS). Pre-registration should be done through your Codex Contact Point who can access this system at: www.codexalimentarius. org/login.

On-site registration of participants will take place at the Jaarbeurs Media Plaza/Polar Center on:

Monday 17 April 2023: from 07:30-16:00 CET

Tuesday 18 April 2023: from 08:00-16.00 CET

Name badges will be distributed at the registration desk. Delegates are requested to wear name badges visibly in order to gain entry to the meeting rooms.

#### LIVE BROADCAST

The plenary session meetings will be broadcast in listening mode only via Zoom in English, French and Spanish. The broadcast option will not offer delegations participating online the possibility of making interventions. In order to make interventions, Codex members and Observers therefore need to have at least one delegate physically present at the venue.

#### DOCUMENTS

#### **INTERPRETATION**

Simultaneous interpretation will be provided in English, French and Spanish. The interpreters ask the delegates to provide all pre-formulated comments in advance (printed or per e-mail to info@codexalimentarius.nl)

#### SEATING

The Dutch CCCF secretariat reserves the right to limit the number of chairs at the desks to a certain number per delegates. Additional seats will be available at the back of the plenary room.

#### **VISA INFORMATION**

Participants are advised to contact the nearest Embassy or Consulate of the Government of The Netherlands as soon as possible in order to allow sufficient time for the processing of visa applications. It is wise to apply for a visa (Schengenvisa) at least one month in advance. It is not possible to obtain a visa at the airports on arrival.

The Dutch CCCF secretariat does not issue personalised invitations for meetings of the CCCF. The Codex invitation for the CCCF16 to Codex members and observers is send to all relevant Netherlands Embassies, to alert them that visa applications for the meeting can be expected. ## **ARRIVAL DETAILS**

The international airport in the Netherlands is Amsterdam Schiphol Airport.

There is a direct train connection from Schiphol Airport to Utrecht Centraal (Utrecht Central Station). Trains leave very regularly (every 10 minutes), a single trip takes about 30 minutes and costs around 10 euro.

A train ticket can be purchased at Schiphol at the desk of the Dutch Railway Company (Nederlandse Spoorwegen – NS) or at a yellow NS ticket machine with a blue sign and white NS logo on top. Make sure to buy a ticket in the train station of the airport before entering a train because it is not possible to buy one in the train.

The Jaarbeurs and many hotels are within walking distance from Utrecht Centraal railway station. For more distant destinations within Utrecht there is an extensive system of public transport. WIFI will be available at the meeting venue.

**LUNCH FACILITIES** There are many facilities for lunch nearby. In the building of Jaarbeurs Media Plaza you can find a food court. Around Utrecht Centraal train station there are many different options for lunch. On the other side of the railway station there is a large shopping mall with supermarkets and lunch venues (Hoog Catharijne).

**BANKING FACILITIES** There are cash dispenser machines at the Central Station. They are in operation 24/7 and accept most cards.

**CURRENCY** Only the Euro will be accepted in the Netherlands. Major credit cards are accepted in most of the hotels and stores but not in supermarkets.

**OFFICIAL LANGUAGE** The official language of the Netherlands is Dutch. English is widely spoken.

## **PUBLIC TRANSPORT**

The Netherlands has an extensive public transport network, which makes it easy to travel around the country. Tickets for public transport are available at the ticket machines at the stations.

- Traveling by train: Intercity trains runs between the larger cities and Sprinters (slower) trains connect smaller stations. It's easy to explore The NetherlandsHolland by train.
- Travelling by tram, metro and bus: To plan your door-to-door trip within the city use the public transport journey planner, just indicate departure point and destination in a

**BIKE RENTALS** Renting a bike costs on average from 8 to 15 euro a day, depending on the type of bike. You will find numerous bike rentals.

**TIME ZONE** The time in the Netherlands is GMT + 01:00 hour.

**CLIMATE** The Netherlands has a moderate coastal climate with cool summers and mild winters. The average temperature (day time) in April is 10 degrees Celsius. As rain is not uncommon at any time of the year, we advise participants to bring a raincoat or an umbrella.

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## The Netherlands/ Utrecht

The Netherlands is best known for tulips, windmills and clogs. Kinderdijk's 19 windmills are on the World Heritage List. Dutch flowers are well known. Over the centuries, the Dutch had to protect themselves against water by building dikes and reclaiming land from the sea, thus creating famous lowland polders and impressive water defences.

**Utrecht** is the capital and most populous city in the Dutch province of the same name, Utrecht. It is located in the eastern corner of the Randstad conurbation and is the fourth largest city in the Netherlands with a population of 361.742 in 2022.

Utrecht's ancient city center features many buildings and structures, several dating as far back to the Middle Ages. It has been the religious center of the Netherlands since the 8th century. Utrecht was the most important city in the Netherlands until the 17th century, the Dutch Golden Age, when it was surpassed by Amsterdam as the country's cultural center and most populous city.

Utrecht is host to Utrecht University, the largest university in the Netherlands, as well as several other institutions of higher education. Due to its central position within the country, it is an important transport hub for both rail and road transport. It has the second highest number of cultural events in the Netherlands, after Amsterdam.
