- Quicker and more accurate compilation process














## OCS user types and roles

- Review Owner: Codex Secretariat (OCS role: Admin-Author).
- **CCP**: Codex Contact Point (OCS role for members: Admin-Author; OCS role for observers: Author).
- **Deputy** (optional): user delegated by CCP to perform all actions but user creation and final publishing (OCS role: Author).
- Reviewer (optional): all other users, able to insert comments in the system within a workgroup if invited.
- Participants (to a review): CCP, Deputy, Reviewer.
- **User**: everyone holding an OCS account, including the Review Owner.






