FINANCIAL AND BUDGETARY MATTERS

BUDGET SITUATION 2004/2005 AND PROPOSED BUDGET 2006/2007

BACKGROUND

- 1. In accordance with Rule XII.1 of the Commission's Rules of Procedure, the Secretariat submits an estimate of expenditure based on the proposed programme of work of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies, together with information concerning expenditures for the previous financial period. The estimate of expenditure shall make provisions for the operating expenses of the Commission and the subsidiary bodies of the Commission established under Rule X.1(a) and X.1(b)(ii) and for the expenses relating to staff assigned to the Programme and other expenditures incurred in connection with the servicing of the latter. The present document provides information on the budget for the current period (2004/2005) and the proposed budget for the biennium 2006/2007. The information on expenditures in the previous budget period (2002/2003) was presented to the 27th Session of the Commission (see ALINORM 04/27/10 Rev).
- 2. It should be noted that as regards the budgetary and accounting arrangements, since the biennium 2002/2003, the Joint FAO/WHO Food Standards Programme is managed within the FAO Regular Programme as Entity 221P2¹, with the WHO contribution to the Programme as external income.

3. At the 27th Session of the Commission, the Representative of FAO, referring to the discussion at the 54th Session of the Executive Committee², indicated that information would be provided, in the future, regarding the FAO and WHO budget allocated to Codex-related activities, especially scientific advice requested by Codex as well as that requested by member countries. Such report will be presented to the Commission separately as an information document.

BUDGET FOR 2004/2005

- 4. The 27th Session of the Commission noted the budgetary situation of the Codex programme for 2004/2005 and requested the parent organizations to continue to assign a high priority to the Joint FAO/WHO Food Standards Programme.³
- 5. Subsequent to the 27th Session of the Commission, the WHO Secretariat confirmed its biennial contribution to Codex as amounting at US\$ 1,225,000.
- 6. The Adjusted Programme of Work and Budget (PWB) 2004/2005, as approved, is shown in the second column of Table 1.
- 7. In addition to the contribution from the Regular Budget, WHO is contributing the costs of a WHO staff member assigned to the Codex Secretariat since February 2005. Furthermore, FAO has received the secondment of two professional officers and two associate professional officers assigned to the Codex Secretariat.

BUDGET PROPOSALS FOR 2006/2007

- 8. At the time of preparation of the present document, several budgetary scenarios are being studied by the parent organizations. As regards FAO, its organization-wide budgetary level will be determined by the 33rd Session of the FAO Conference in November 2005. As regards WHO, the Organization's budget proposals have been approved by the 58th Session of the World Health Assembly (May 2005). The regular budget for the food safety area of work at Headquarters has decreased by 14%, while the overall budget has increased by 5 %. This makes the relative share of voluntary contributions more prominent. Inspite of these changes in the source of funding, WHO management is committed to maintaining the WHO contribution to Codex at the 2004/2005 level.
- 9. The proposed budget based on the Zero Real Growth (ZRG) scenario in FAO and on the expected level of WHO contribution is summarised in third column of Table 1. The final Codex budget for 2006/2007 and the corresponding level of Codex activities will be dependent on the decisions and guidance of the governing bodies. Updates on the budgetary situation for 2006/2007 will be provided to 57th Session of the Executive Committee.
- 10. In addition to the Regular Budget estimates, WHO is expecting to continue to contribute the service of a WHO staff member assigned to the Codex Secretariat throughout the biennium. Similarly, the FAO is expecting to continue to further support the Codex Secretariat through the secondment of two professional officers.
