CURRENCY DISPOSITIONS:

The currency unit in Mexico is the Peso, which circulates in the following values: Bills (pesos): 20, 50, 100, 200, 500 y 1000 Coins:10c, .20c, .50c, 1, 2, 5, 10





ELECTRIC VOLTAGE:

Electric voltage in Mexico City is 127 Volts c.a. +/- 10%, 60Hz. The plugs are American style, that is, flat. An adaptor might be needed.



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BANKING SERVICES:

It is recommended to change currency at Banks or Currency Exchange Bureaus, as they'll offer you more favorable exchange rates than hotels and some restaurants. On the other hand, many banking institutions have ATMs which will accept cards from major international banking institutions such as Visa, Master Card, Electron, Cirrus, American Express, Diner's and others.

In order to make use of the service, you must buy the corresponding ticket at the authorized points of sale at the Airport, to obtain safe transportation at a reasonable price.

Likewise, se recommend requesting a taxi at restaurants, hotels o similar establishments. For your security, upon boarding a taxi on the street, check the driver's identification and make sure he'll set on the taxi meter.

At the southwest of the City, on Insurgentes Sur Avenue, between Eje 10 Sur and Periférico, headquarter of the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de Mexico (National Autonomous University of Mexico). Many of its buildings are adorned with mural paintings by distinguished Mexican artists such as Diego Rivera (on the University Stadium), David Alfaro Siqueiros (Rectoría Tower) and Juan O'Gorman (Central Library).



MODERN ARCHITECTURE:


Mexico City is filled with historical monuments showing the past of a constantly growing nation, which we can appreciate in the modern architecture all around the metropolis. In order to be able to admire it, all you have to do is visit those areas considered as most representative of contemporaneous architecture:

Roma and Condesa Districts feature elegant art nouveau and art deco style houses and buildings, once home to porfiriana high society at the onset of the Twentieth Century.





The Old San Ildefonso College (Antiguo Colegio de San Ildefonso) has three patios known respectively as the Trainees' Patio, the Small College Patio, and the Big College Patio. The latter features mural paintings by famous Mexican artists such as Diego Rivera.





RELAXATION AND AMUSEMENT:

Mexico City offers a wide variety of choices - natural areas, parks and zoos. Among the best relaxation and amusement spots, you will find:



The Chapultepec Park (Bosque de Chapultepec). One of the major natural sanctuaries in the City, and a traditional family recreational area, due to the many activities to be carried out in its three different sections, including picnics, strolls, bicycle rides or boat rowing on its artificial lakes, as well as museum visits and globe riding up to 400 feet high.



The Chapultepec Zoo (Zoológico de Chapultepec). In the 1st section of Chapultepec Park. It is a 17 acre area showing over 200 animal species, some of them endangered. You will see giant pandas, gorillas, bears, hippos, giraffes, and wolves among many others whose habitat was

successfully recreated, to the point of achieving – many times – breeding in captivity. It also features an aviary and reptile keeping facilities and cages.



Frida Kahlo's "Blue House" Museum (Museo Casa Frida Kahlo 'Casa Azul'). Once home to painters Diego Rivera and Frida Kahlo. Various rooms show personal items, retables, popular art, and a grand collection of prehispanic objects from West and South as well as Gulf of Mexico addition cultures. in to plastic masterpieces by artists such as José Clemente Orozco, José María Velasco, and Paul Klee, among others.



Night Life. If you are coming to Mexico for the first time, don't forget to visit downtown Plaza Garibaldi, where you will enjoy mariachi music and relish one of Mexico's most traditional liquors: tequila, of course! Walk around the plaza and its gardens and have a great time listening to the vast repertory of Mexican music.
