BACKGROUND

At its Second Session the Committee considered a proposal to elaborate a new individual cheese standard for "Parmesan" and requested Germany, in collaboration with France and IDF, to identify product(s) in question and to prepare a paper on trade statistics and justification for the elaboration of the standard for consideration by the Committee at its Third Session. Due to time constraints, however, the Committee was unable to consider a paper prepared by Germany¹ and agreed to include it on the agenda of its Fourth Session. The content of CX/MMP 98/11 is reproduced below.

INTRODUCTION

The German delegation presented the "Parmesan" proposal to the Committee in view of the fact that there is considerable international trade in cheese under this denomination. Parmesan is a generic name, but there is no clear definition of the product at international level.

Parmesan is traded in the form of loaf hard cheese, grated hard cheese and mixtures of different grated cheese varieties. To protect consumers from deception and to ensure fair border-crossing trade, the accepted views and product regulations of the individual countries should be harmonized in one standard.

Such a standard worked out on the basis of the currently prevailing economic realities would facilitate international trade because the requirements in terms of composition and quality of Parmesan cheese would be defined.

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The situation characterized by ambiguity and lack of transparency is reflected in statistical surveys. Parmesan cheese, in the majority of countries, is not recorded as a separate item; but the data concerning Parmesan are covered by the headings "hard cheese" or "grated cheese" or just "cheese in general". Because of a lack of clear and uniform assignment of Parmesan to the official production and trade statistics, the German delegation cannot provide any statistical data from official sources on the production and marketing of Parmesan at international level.

However, the German delegation received the following information from the International Dairy Federation:
