





Guidance document on the management of foodborne outbreaks





Draft Guidelines for the management of **Biological Foodborne Outbreaks**

Chaired by Denmark and co-chaired by the European Union and Chile

Purpose:

To provide guidance on the management of foodborne outbreaks.

Address preparedness, detection, response and recovery with the intent of limiting the extent of such events. The scope is limited to biological hazards.

Provide a supplement and a link to documents developed by FAO/WHO and Codex texts, as appropriate.

Define the role of competent authorities and collaboration with food business operators and other stakeholders during foodborne outbreaks

Overall goal:

- Limit public health impact

• Reduce economic consequences (e.g. recalls, trade restrictions)

Ensure clear communication (consumers, press, trade partners etc.)





Timeline – work done

<u>2017</u>

CCFH49: The EU presented a project document. It was decided as new work. Approved by CAC41 in 2018.

<u>2018</u>

A draft was presented and discussed at the CCFH50. Key issues were

- the scope
- rapid risk assessment or outbreak assessment -
- references to and overlap with existing WHO and FAO publications. Returned to the WG at step 2 and an eWG was established.







Timeline – work done

<u>2019</u>

An electronic working group was convened. In total 31 member countries, 1 member organisations and 4 observer organisations signed up for the eWG. Comments were recieved from 14 countries.

Questions:

- References to WHO publication?
- Inclusion of templates as examples in Annex? -

At CCFH51 key issues were references to WHO/FAO documents and Annexes. The draft was forwarded to CAC43 for adoption at Step 5.

Timeline – work done

2020

CCFH52 was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Deadline for comments was also postponed.

<u>2021</u>

A circular letter (CL 2021//04/OCS-FH) was issued to request comments at Step 6

A revised draft was developed based on comments received and circulated in the October 2021 through circular letter (CL 2021/72/OCCS/FH) with a deadline for commenting 8 January 2022.

Based on comments from the second round of commenting, the chairs have prepared a new draft to be considered by CCFH52 – CRD2.





Comments and action taken

Comments from 20 member countries, 1 member organization(EU) and 1 observer.

Most comments were editorial or proposing of elaborating the text


