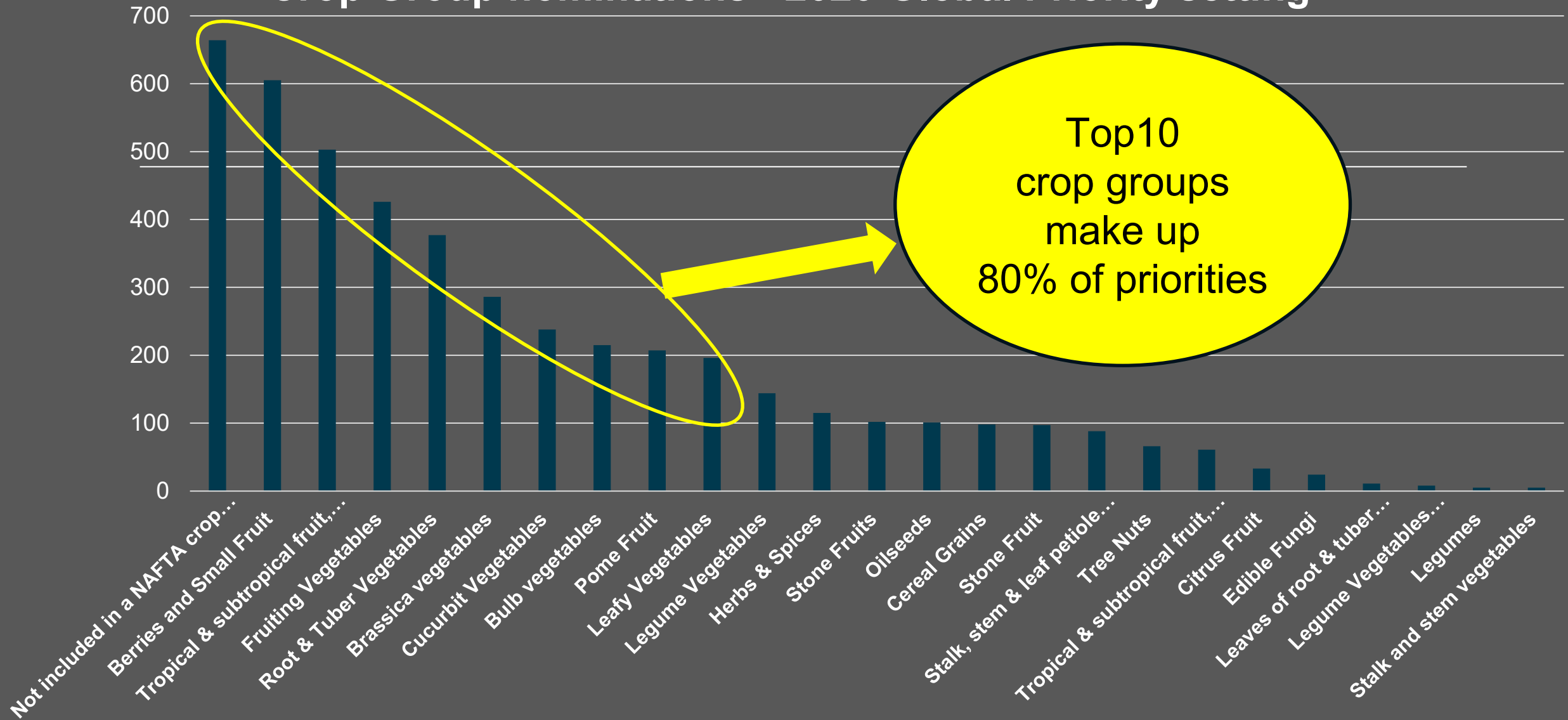

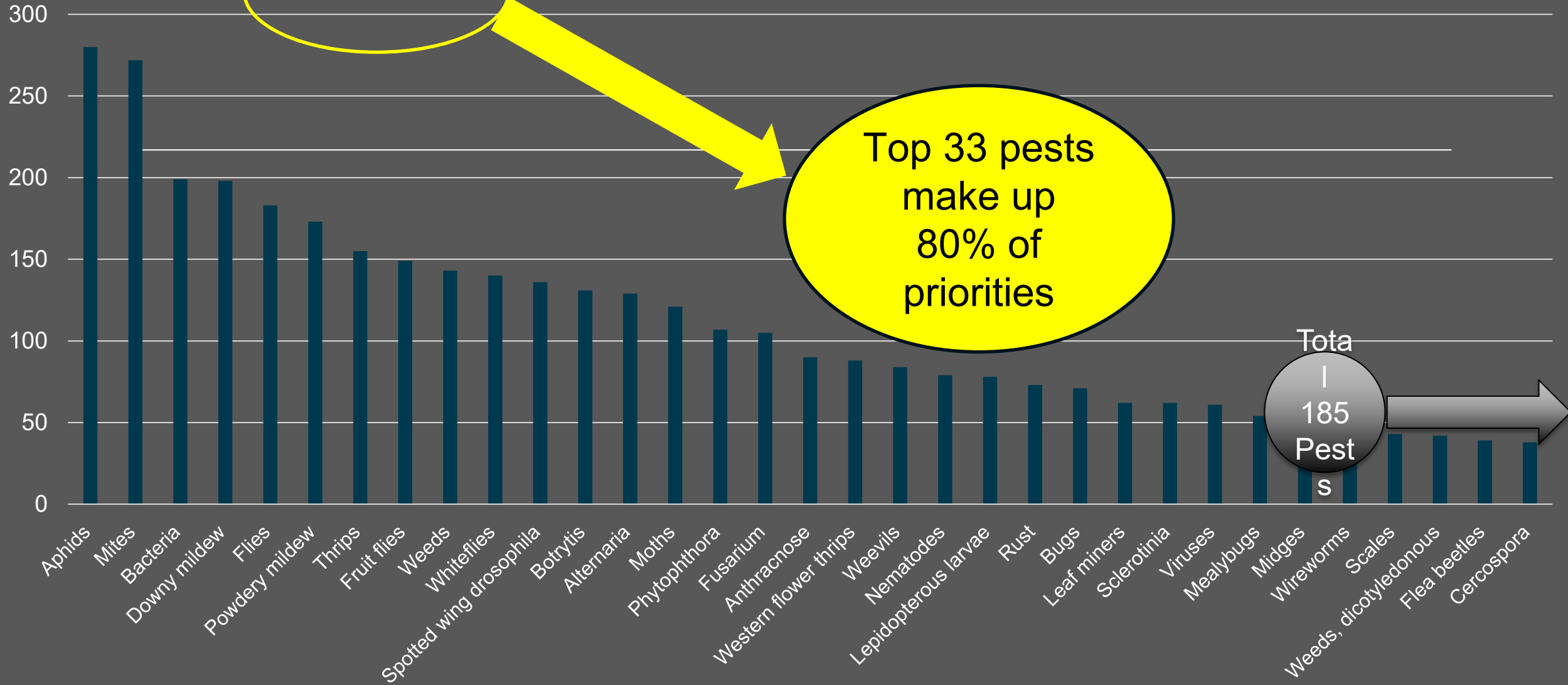

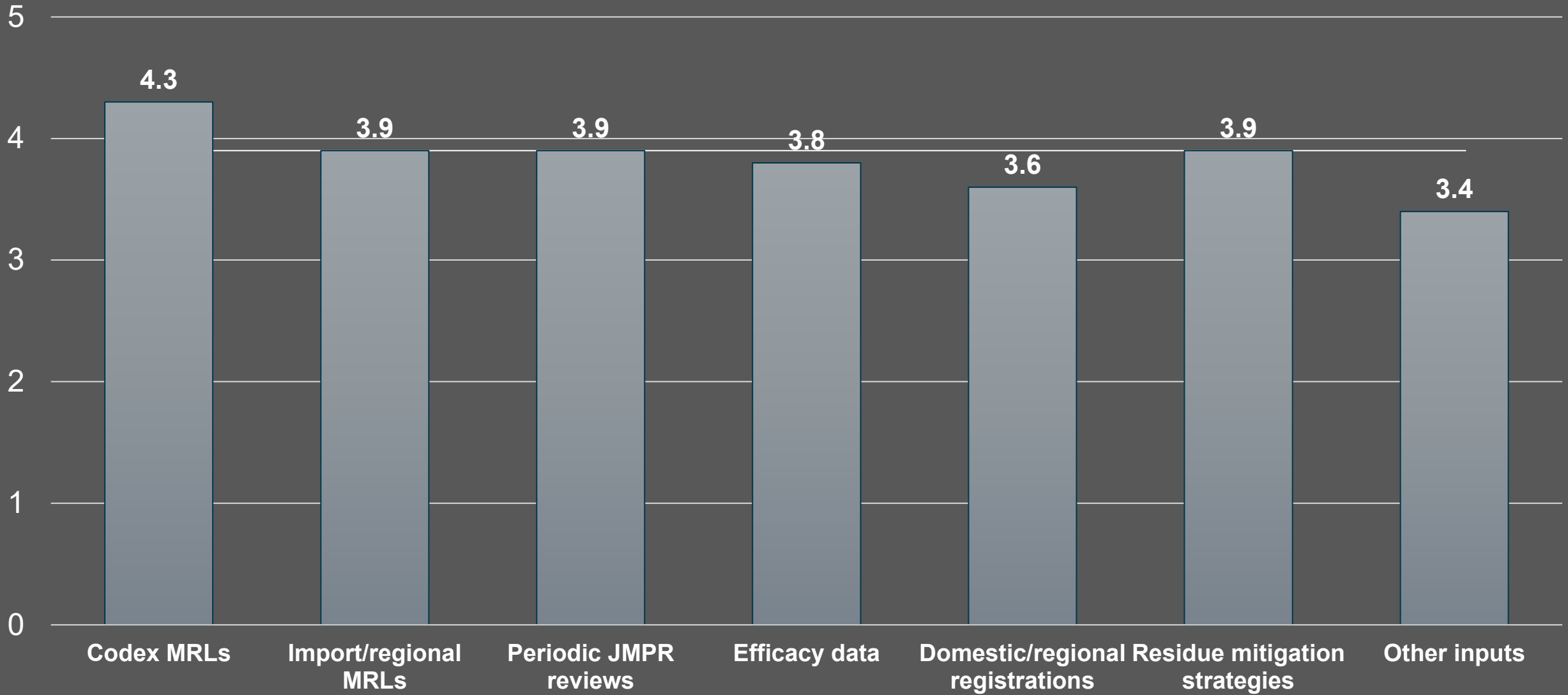
Crop Group nominations - 2020 Global Priority setting



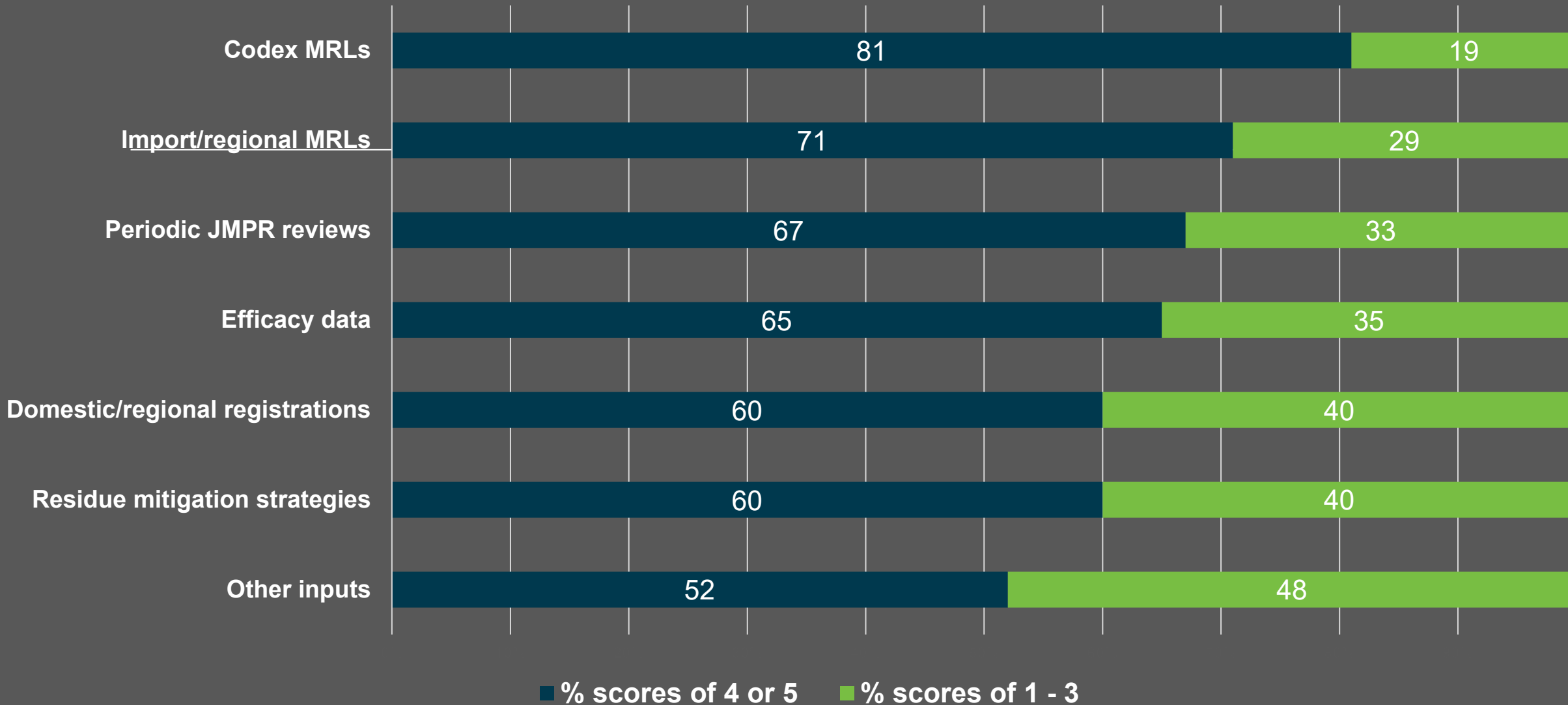
Top 33 Pest nominations - 2020 Global Priority setting

Percentage distribution of ranking scores of 1-3 and 4-5



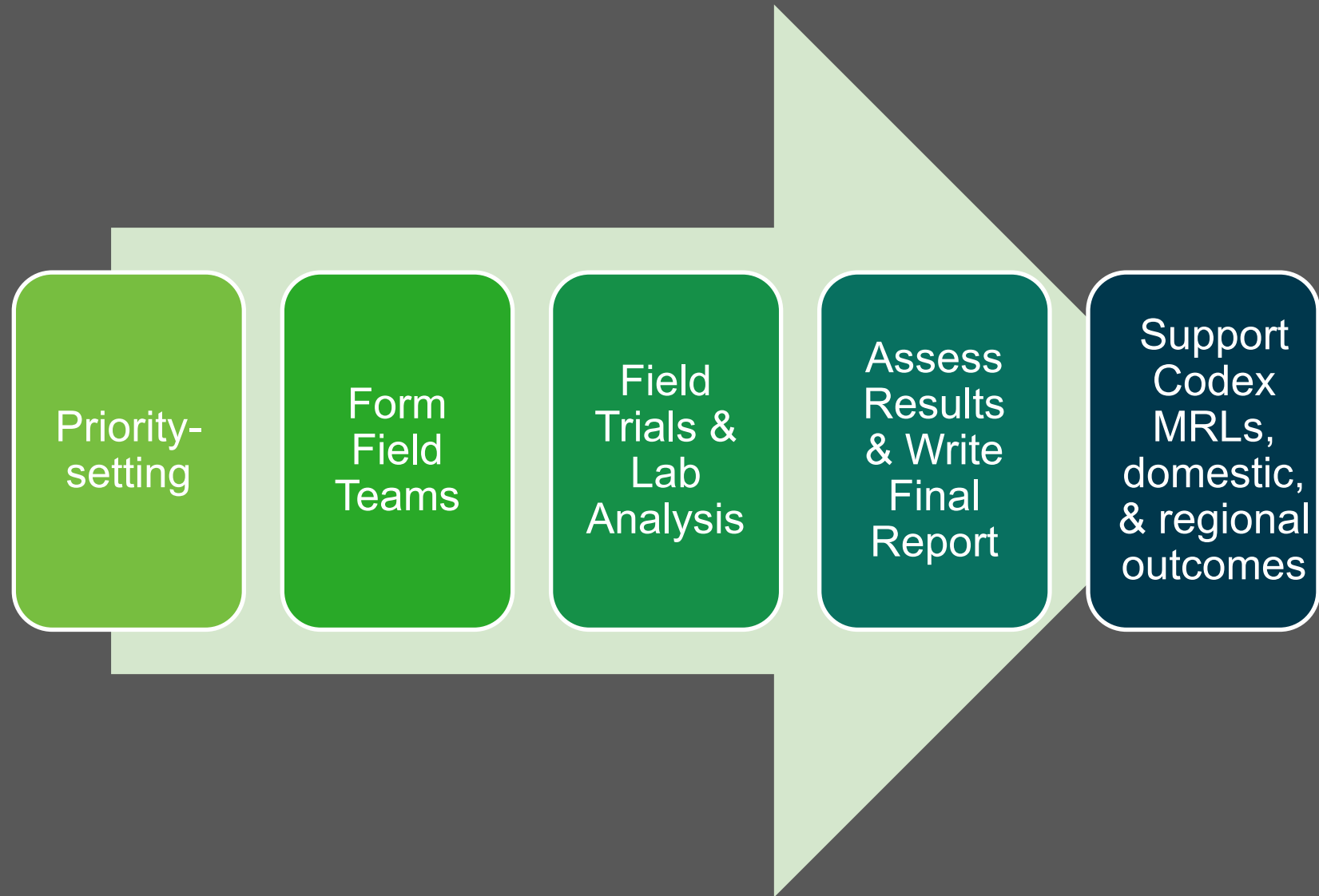
GMUS4 KEY takeaways

- **Technology:** Leveraging new technologies for crop protection outcomes
- **Engagement:** Increasing connections with growers around the world – establishing commodity liaison groups - strategies
- **Strengthening Codex:** Supporting CCPR/JMPR via crop grouping and data generation in new and existing chemistries
- **Importance of Minor Uses:** Building political will and support investments in minor crops / data generation
- **Increasing and measuring impact:** Incorporation of environmental and social/economic indicators/outcomes
- **Creative and pragmatic solutions:** Incorporation of biological solutions, residue mitigation projects, regional registrations, import tolerances etc.

Priority-setting going forward

- Call for nominations in Q1 2025
- Develop strategies for key needs
- Set a 3-year workplan in Q2 2025
- Register on MUF website for updates
