REPORT OF THE ELECTRONIC WORKING GROUP ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CODEX STRATEGIC PLAN 2020-2025 AND THE CODEX COMMUNICATIONS WORKPLAN FOR 2023-2024

Background

During the twenty-second meeting of the FAO/WHO Coordinating Committee for Latin America and the Caribbean (CCLAC22), it was not possible to discuss agenda item 7 "Implementation of the Codex Strategic Plan 2020-2025" due to lack of time.

Given the importance of the issue for the region and since it was linked to other issues previously discussed at the meeting including the celebration of the sixtieth anniversary of Codex, CCLAC22 agreed to establish an Electronic Working Group (EWG) that would work in Spanish and English, under the leadership of Ecuador (CCLAC Coordinator), and in which Members and Observers from the region could participate. The terms of reference are as follows:

- review and update the Regional Workplan 2022-2024 to support the implementation of the Codex Strategic Plan 2020-2025;
- review and update the Regional Communications Workplan 2022-2024;
- finalize the update of the workplans within six months in order to facilitate their implementation before the twenty-third CCLAC meeting.

The list of participants is provided in Appendix 3.

Discussion

Ecuador, as Chair of the WG, proposed a timetable consisting of three rounds of comments. This was included in the invitation letter and set out a draft for the Implementation of the Codex Strategic Plan 2020-2025.

The members of the EWG discussed the Strategic Plan proposal and the discussions were summarized as follows:

- emphasize the importance of setting out arguments in defence of scientific principles in Codex standardsetting work when drafting the Strategic Plan and its objectives.
- the importance of actively contributing to the implementation of the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan, involving and supporting developing countries given that they do not fully meet conditions for reacting to emerging situations. The countries proposed to report on the activities implemented by each country through the CCLAC Secretariat.
- promote cooperation actions with non-profit organizations and institutions such as the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) to improve participation of Member Countries in the region in the different Codex forums such as seminars, colloquiums and twinning activities.
- provide information on events and other activities to the Codex Secretariat for publication on the official website.
- on activity 2.1, reconsider the period quoted. We suggest doing this on a quarterly basis as it provides flexibility to deal with different situations or setbacks that may arise in a one-month period.
