



# THE 54™ SESSION OVERVIEW

The 54th Session of the Codex Committee on Food Hygiene (CCFH), which will be co-hosted by the United States of America and Kenya, will convene as an in-person physical meeting from 11 – 15 March, 2024. CCFH54 will take place in Nairobi, Kenya at the Emara Ole-Sereni Hotel (<a href="https://emara.ole-sereni.com/">https://emara.ole-sereni.com/</a>). The Session will also be webcast in English, French, and Spanish.

The on-site registration desk will be open on Saturday, March 9, 2024, from 14:00-18:00 EAT and on Sunday, March 10, 2024, from 08:00 – 18:00 EAT to collect badges and other information and materials. Printed documents will not be provided but will be available on the CCFH54 webpage.

On Sunday, March 10, 2024, there will be three-hour Physical Working Groups (PWG) on both the draft Guidelines for the control of Shiga-toxin producing Escherichia coli (STEC) and the draft Guidelines for the safe use and re-use of water in food production. The PWGs will also be webcast in English, French, and Spanish.

The CCFH54 plenary session will run from Monday, March 11 until Wednesday, March 13, 2024. The PWG on CCFH Work Priorities (New Work Proposals/Forward Work Plan) will meet in the afternoon on March 11th. A FAO/WHO Side Event on Food Allergens is also planned during the week to brief CCFH54 on the progress of the scientific advice and updates from the Codex Committee on Food Labelling (CCFL).

Thursday, March 14, 2024 will be the report writing day for the Codex Secretariat so delegates may explore Nairobi. An International Commission on Microbiological Specifications for Foods (ICMSF) Side Event, preceded by lunch, is also planned for the afternoon of March 14th.

Report Adoption for CCFH54 will occur in person on Friday, March 15, 2024.

Please note that the invitation to CCFH54 issued by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and the World Health Organization (WHO) requests that delegates register by **February 11th, 2024**.

We would encourage all delegates who expect to attend CCFH54 in person to register well in advance to ensure that relevant visas, clearances, and appropriate seating arrangements will be available for them at the meeting.

\*\*Please note that the CCFH meeting registration is a separate process from the hotel reservations for sleeping accommodations at the Emara Ole-Sereni Hotel and the 2.5.4 Ole-Sereni Hotel (please see section below CCFH54 Venue Hotel).





CCFH54 will be an in-person meeting that will also be webcast on YouTube to enable those who cannot attend physically to follow the proceedings, which will help ensure increased transparency and maximum participation.

Participants not able to join their Member Country or Observer Organization delegations in person at CCFH54 in Nairobi will be able to follow the discussions during the PWGs and the Plenary Sessions in English, French and Spanish via the YouTube webcast. They should not be registered as delegates for the meeting.

Only the delegates present in person for CCFH54 will be able to intervene during the discussions. Member Countries and Observer Organizations should plan to send at least one delegate to attend CCFH54 in Nairobi so that their interventions are included in the discussion.



# PASSPORT AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

The United States and Kenya believe it is important that delegates from all Member Countries and Organizations have the opportunity to participate in Codex meetings. Having a valid passport and completing and submitting the application for the electronic travel authorization (ETA)— Kenya's version of a visa application, will ensure that the work of Codex accurately reflects the views and contributions of all its members.

#### **Passport validity:**

Passports need to be valid for 6 months from the date of the ETA application and should have at least two blank pages.

#### ETA:

The ETA, which allows visitors to travel to Kenya for tourist, transit, and other purposes, is valid for one entry within three months. Delegates should apply for the ETA at: <a href="https://evisa.go.ke/">https://evisa.go.ke/</a>

# COVID-RELATED INFORMATION

The Government of Kenya no longer requires proof of either COVID-19 vaccination or a negative COVID-19 PCR test for entry into Kenya.

Travelers with flu-like symptoms, will be required to undergo a rapid antigen test at their own expense of \$30 USD and will be required to fill the passenger locator form on the 'jitenge' platform. Those who test positive will be required to take a PCR test at their own expense of \$50 USD and self-isolate as per Ministry of Health guidance on isolation. Those with severe symptoms are also required to isolate as per the prevailing isolation requirements for mild, moderate and severe disease, even if they do not test positive.



# **ABOUT NAIROBI, KENYA**

Located in southern Kenya, Nairobi, the capital city of Kenya, is a fusion of rich diversity, vibrant culture, and breathtaking natural beauty. It is also home to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and the United Nations Office at Nairobi (UNON), along with a multitude of foreign organizations and diplomatic missions. In addition, Nairobi has earned the nickname 'Silicon Savannah' due to its flourishing technology sector, signifying its prominence in the tech industry.

The most striking feature is the Nairobi National Park, a haven of wildlife enveloped within the city's modern landscape. Adjacent to the bustling streets and towering skyscrapers, lions roam freely, giraffes elegantly grace the landscape, and zebras punctuate the urban skyline at the Nairobi National Park. This unique urban

sanctuary paints a vivid picture of the extraordinary coexistence between civilization and the wild.

Swahili and English are the official languages of Nairobi, but the city's population also speaks a variety of ethnic languages.

Nairobi's diverse culture, arts, and entertainment scene attracts both residents and tourists. This adds to the vibrancy of the city and fosters creativity and cultural exchange.

Nairobi's culinary culture reflects Kenya's diversity. You can savor traditional Kenyan dishes like Ugali (cornmeal porridge) and Nyama Choma (grilled meat), as well as international cuisines, including Indian, Chinese, and Middle Eastern.

Nairobi is located near eastern Africa's agricultural heartland, and a number of primary products are routed through Nairobi before being exported via Mombasa. The agricultural sector is the backbone of the economy, contributing approximately 33 percent of Kenya's Gross Domestic Product (GDP). The agriculture sector employs more than 40 percent of the total population and 70 percent of the rural population.

#### Flying to Nairobi, Kenya

Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (NBO), is an international airport serving Nairobi. It is located only 8.4 miles (13.5km) from the Emara Ole-Sereni Hotel and takes approximately 20–30 minutes depending on traffic.


#### **TAXIS**

# INFORMATION

#### Weather

The average temperature in Nairobi in March ranges from a high of 84°F (29°C) to a low of 59°F (15°C) with moderate humidity. A typical day is described as pleasantly warm with a gentle breeze. There is typically a 33% chance of moderate rain on an average day, amounting to about 0.62 inches (15.7 mm) of precipitation. The average March day in Nairobi has about 12.1 hours of daylight, with sunrise around 6:37 AM and sunset around 6:44 PM.

#### **Electrical Current**

Kenya operates on a 240V supply voltage (50Hz). The associated plug type is G, which is the plug that has three rectangular pins in a triangular pattern.

#### Currency

The Kenyan Shilling (KES) is the official currency. Currently approximately \$1 USD = 150.30 Kenyan Shilling. Mpesa is widely acceptable but it is optional.

Banking facilities and ATMs are found throughout Kenya's major travel destinations and all major credit cards are widely accepted, in particular MasterCard, Visa and American Express. There is also an ATM at the Venue Hotel.

#### **Tips and Taxes**

The Value Added Tax (VAT)-- the standard rate for taxable goods and services, as well as imports- is currently at 16% in Kenya.

CCFH Delegates should plan to tip around 10-15% in Kenyan restaurants. However, the exact tip amount when eating out in Kenya depends on the place, occasion, and order size. It's customary to give your waiter or waitress a slightly higher tip than you would a bartender, as they are likely sharing their tip with the kitchen staff.



The Central Business District (CBD) is a great area for those planning to visit central attractions like the Kenyatta International Convention Centre, City Market, Jamia Mosque, Maasai markets, Central Park, Uhuru Park, Nairobi National Museum, Railways Museum, and shopping. The Westlands area, located just north of the center, is also an interesting neighborhood to check out and is popular with expats.

Lang'ata and Karen are two additional areas with popular tourist attractions such as the Giraffe Centre, Uhuru Gardens, Karen Blixen Museum, Bomas of Kenya, Carnivore Restaurant, Kazuri Beads Factory, and Sheldrick Wildlife Trust Elephant Orphanage. These areas are also convenient for those visiting Nairobi National Park.

CCFH54 will feature a Tour Desk where you may learn about all that Nairobi and the surrounding area has to offer. The Tour Desk will also be able to help you book a variety of sightseeing options, excursions, and activities during your free time.
