SUBJECT: Request for comments on the Priority list of contaminants for evaluation or re-evaluation by JECFA

BACKGROUND

1. For background information, please refer to the discussion held, and decisions made on the priority list at the 17th Session of the Codex Committee on Contaminants in Foods (CCCF17, 2024)¹ available in the report of CCCF17 on the Codex webpage².

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS

2. Codex Members and Observers are invited to provide comments on the priority list of contaminants for evaluation or re-evaluation by the Joint FAO/WHO Expert Committee on Food Additives (JECFA) by completing the template attached to the Annex of this circular letter³. In particular, information on the availability of relevant data or necessary for JECFA to perform the requested evaluation/re-evaluation is highly desirable.
3. This CL should be considered together with CL 2025/08-CF on the review of Codex standards and related texts for contaminants regarding proposals for revising maximum levels (MLs) that may need re-evaluation by JECFA.
4. Coordinated comments on the two CLs will assist CCCF18 (2025) in better assessing its future work vis-à-vis ongoing work, following up on the outcomes of JECFA evaluations and ad hoc expert consultations, and consequently addressing new work more strategically on Codex standards and related texts for contaminants in food and feed.
5. The Working Group on Priorities, which will meet before CCCF18, will consider comments submitted in reply to this CL to prepare recommendations for revising the priority list for consideration by the plenary session.

GUIDANCE ON THE PROVISION OF COMMENTS

6. Comments should be submitted through the Codex Contact Points of Codex Members and Observers using the Online Commenting System (OCS).
7. Contact Points of Codex Members and Observers may log into the OCS and access the document open for comment by selecting "Enter" in the "My reviews" page, available after login to the system.

- 2.1 Whether or not the occurrence of the compound in commodities will have the potential to cause public health and/or trade problems;
- 2.2 Whether or not commodities containing the compound are in international trade and represent a significant portion of the diet; and
- 2.3 Commitment that a dossier (as complete as possible) will be available for evaluation by the JECFA.

2.4 Relevant justification and information on the following prioritization criteria¹:

- 2.4.1 Consumer protection from the point of view of health, food safety, ensuring fair practices in the food trade;
- 2.4.2 The needs and concerns of developing countries;
- 2.4.3 The diversity of national legislations and any apparent impediments to international trade;
- 2.4.4 Work already undertaken by other international organisations;
- 2.4.5 The prospect of completing the work in a reasonable period of time;
- 2.4.6 The impact on international trade (i.e., the magnitude of the problem in international trade);
- 2.4.7 Compliance with the Codex Alimentarius Commission's Strategic Plan¹ and its relevant plans of work;
- 2.4.8 The quality, quantity, adequacy, and availability of data pertinent to performing a risk assessment, including data from developing countries;
- 2.4.9 Compliance with CCCF's Terms of Reference¹;
- 2.4.10 Compliance with JECFA's Terms of Reference²; and
