What do the ILC Conclusions call for?

- ▶ Business has a responsibility to respect human and labour rights in their supply chains, consistent with the UN Guiding Principles, and to comply with the national law wherever they do business.
- ▶ A list of actions to be taken by governments and social partners.
- ▶ Policy coherence, collaboration and coordination are required at the global, regional, sectoral and national levels.

▶ Actions to be taken by the ILO:

- ILO standards
- Labour administration and labour inspection
- Social dialogue
- Sectoral approaches
- Policy coherence
- Guidance to enterprises
- Action plan export processing zones
- Data and research
- Review of the MNE Declaration
- Tripartite meeting

▶ Programme of action to be presented to the Governing Body in November 2016.
