



### Key messages from the HLPE Report (1/2)

- 1. Putting youth at the centre of the policy convergence process.

  This would involve approaches and policies to strengthen youth engagement and employment in food systems, based on the pillars of rights, equity, agency and recognition.
- 2. Recognizing the diversity of contexts and of youths, including by gender, and ensuring context-specific employment and labour market policies that are economically rewarding and intellectually satisfying at global, national and local levels. This would involve recognition to and support for the development of a range of skills and innovations.





## Key messages from the HLPE report (2/2)

- 3. Ensuring youth have equitable access to resources, including re-distributive and mediated market policies, to access land, water, forests, labour, knowledge, information, agricultural extension, finance, credit, markets, technology and supporting institutions for sustainable food systems transformation.
- 4. Strengthening digital technologies has the potential to "expand knowledge democracy", together with overcoming ongoing digital divides so that these benefits are not concentrated on only those youth with access to high levels of financial capital.
- 5. Promoting youth-centred innovation for sustainable food systems using different systems of knowledge and practice, needs to be based within more democratic and inclusive governance and organizational models.
