Main conclusions of the HLPE Report on price volatility and food security

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Four characteristics of the HLPE process

- A steering committee, a Project Team (Mr. B. Daviron, Mr. N. Dembélé, Ms. S. Murphy, Mr. S. Rashid), electronic consultations, expert reviewing
- A broad review of the literature
- Demand driven and oriented towards recommendations
- A strong attention to the existing diversity of analyses and policy options
- The choice to deal with difficult issues



International food prices movement: three complementary explanations

- Short term: Volatility (too strong and may be excessive)
- Medium term: Cycle, effect of past overproduction and low prices (under-investments in agriculture and bio-fuels boosting policy)
- Long term: Coming and lasting scarcities
 (increasing pressures placed on natural resources) and demand growth (including for energy)



Local food prices movements: two causes

- Imported volatility from international market but also
- Domestic sources of volatility often higher than the imported volatility (natural accident, market imperfections, social unrests ...)



International Policy Options

- Build a food security-oriented trading system
- Adopt the precautionary principle for the regulation of speculation on futures markets
- Coordinate national storage policies
- Curb developed countries' demand for food and feed products (biofuels, animal products)
- Invest to finance the transition toward an ecological agriculture



National Policy Options


- Include the price volatility issue in comprehensive Food Security Strategy Program (FSSP)
- Increase the role of the state in stabilizing domestic prices
- Improve social safety nets: Emergency +
 Prevention



Potential roles for the CFS

- Support the establishment and review of FSSP
- Support AMIS and the inclusion of information on hunger
- Facilitate debates on :
 - how agricultural trade rules could support food security
 - forms of international cooperation regarding world food stocks and food security





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
