List of issues drawn from the discussion in Plenary:

- a) Income inequalities and access to resources as an important obstacle for sustainable development and FSN for all
- b) Conflicts, shocks and crises as key drivers of food insecurity and malnutrition, international migration and internal displacement
- c) Agroecological innovations as a way to contribute to sustainable food systems and to food security and nutrition
- d) Youth engagement and employment in agriculture, the role of young people in policy-making
- e) The articulation of the governance of food systems at different levels and across different sectors and the transformation of food systems for food sovereignty
- f) Urbanization and rural transformation, considering the challenges and opportunities behind increased rural-urban interlinkages and the linkages with innovations and technology to make agriculture and rural areas more attractive
- g) Climate variability and extreme weather events with their impact on availability, access and management of natural resources, including water
- h) Women's empowerment and gender equality in the context of food security and nutrition
- i) Data Collection and Analysis Tools
- j) Resilience of market Systems and risk management tools
